23rd February 2024

Galations 6:9 reminds us that we **should** 'not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up'. This quote caught my eye, as we find ourselves deeply entrenched in Lent which is often aligned with the 'season' for 'doing good'. However, 'will reap, if we do not give up' grew even more relevant for this community as we finally received the green light from the Department of Education and CCMS to announce that we will be commencing Vacation Care from this Easter (Tuesday 2nd April).

Last year, in response to parent feedback, we began the long application process to extend St. Patrick's OSHC to be afforded its own Vacation Care Program. This involved many meetings, school and regional surveys and a long array of paperwork. It was a direct response to a collective parent voice, as we didn't want our families to be disadvantaged. Our OSHC co-ordinator, Claire O'Connell and her team, run a comprehensive program and an outline of Easter Vacation Care activities will be included in next week's newsletter. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Claire for the preparation she has already started in anticipation to this 'good news' and to all those busy parents who took the time to express their need for this service. The program will be released next week and bookings open in Week 7 with hours of operation from 7am -6pm. Fees will be \$59 per day (childcare subsidy is calculated from the Vacation care daily fee \$59 - CCS% = Gap fee paid by parent). This will not benefit the school largely other than ensuring parents have access to quality care over their holiday period, when in need. In my opinion, this is significant and a wonderful gain for our community.

This week we also enjoyed our yearly visit from magician Mr. Fye. We welcomed local kindergartens to enjoy the show, then encouraged and welcomed parents to meet the Principal and enjoy a tour of our wonderful school. We had over 30 parents join us. They were afforded a taste of what we have to offer, along with some shared wisdom from Year 1 students, who had recently graduated from Prep and all it has to offer the youngest in our community. VACATION CARE OPENING SOON



St. Patrick's Catholic Primary School Bundaberg Outside School Hours Care (OSHC) is excited to announce the launch of our Vacation Care program in 2024 during the Easter School Holidays.

The program will be operational from 7:00 am to 6:00 pm and will cost \$59 per day.

The Vacation Care program will be published through Xplor Comms function in week 7 of each school term. Once released, families can commence booking through the Xplor Parents App. In week 8, the program opens to the wider school community and other schools.

Assistance is available through Centrelink to help you with the cost of childcare. To receive the subsidy*, you must care for a child 13 or younger who's not attending secondary school, unless an exemption applies. You must also use an approved childcare service, be responsible for paying the childcare fees, and meet residency and immunisation requirements.

*Childcare subsidy is calculated from the Vacation care daily fee \$59 - CCS% = Gap fee paid by parent





HOW TO CLAIM CHILDCARE SUBSIDY

To get Childcare Subsidy (CCS), create a myGov account and link it to Centrelink. Here are the steps to create a myGov account:

- 1. Go to myGov and select Create account.
- 2. Select Continue with email.
- Read the privacy notice and Terms of use.If you understand and agree to the Terms of use, select Next.
- 1. Enter an Email address and select Next.
- 2. Enter the Code sent to your email, then select Next.
- 3. Enter your Mobile number (optional) and select Next.
- 4. Enter the Code sent to your mobile phone and select Next.
- 5. Enter a Password and then Re-enter password.
- 6. Create your 3 Secret questions and answers. Choose from the list or create your own.

PROJECT COMPASSION

Genesis 22:1-2, 9-13, 15-18 | Romans 8:31-34 | Mark 9:2-10

When Jesus took his closest friends to the top of a high mountain, they experienced something quite extraordinary. The transfiguration gave them a glimpse of what it meant for Jesus to be the son of God. It is hardly surprising that Peter said, 'it is wonderful for us to be here.' The Gospel also tells us that Jesus' friends were frightened, and this is also easy to understand. They were overwhelmed. Nevertheless, it's not long before Jesus reminds them that he is destined to die. His friends must come down from the mountain and walk with Jesus through all the ordinary and arduous days and weeks that lie ahead.

We can all say 'it is wonderful for us to be here' no matter where that happens to be. Life is full of wonder. That doesn't mean it is always easy. We live in the arms of a very deep mystery. God's love enfolds us.

Throughout Lent, we are called to support Project Compassion, an initiative of Caritas Australia. This year, Project Compassion celebrates 60 years of partnership with some of the most marginal communities in the world. With your help, we have walked alongside literally millions of people in dozens of countries.

This week we encounter the story of Ronita who lives in Quezon City, part of metro Manila in the Philippines. Becoming a mother at a young age meant that her schooling was cut short. Her husband, Lean, leaves for work at 3am and returns at 9pm, earning less than \$US10 per day in a demanding job in waste disposal. On such a small income, Ronita and Lean, along with two young children, are able to rent a room of about 10 square metres.

With your help through Project Compassion, Caritas Australia has been able to support the Faithful Companions of Jesus (FCJ) to run the Alternative Learning System program. This program has meant that Ronita has been able to continue her education. The FCJ sisters provide a safe space for many young people such as Ronita to finish school and find better jobs. Ronita has had the opportunity to change her life.

Caritas Australia believes that the world can be transfigured to become more like the kingdom of God of which Jesus spoke. We can encounter people whom others choose to ignore. When we do so, we discover that here too are children of God. We are asked to listen to them.

SPORTS NEWS

BUNDABERG DISTRICT U12 SCHOOL SPORTS TRIALS-2024

Trial information will be advised in the school's newsletter each week detailing trial information for upcoming individual and team events. Gaining selection in a Bundaberg District Team is the first step on the pathway to representing Wide Bay and Queensland. To represent Bundaberg District, students must be born 2012, 2013 & 2014 (only exceptional 10 year old students will be given permission to trial in team sports). The majority of team sport trials occur in February and March. Please be aware of the following points:

- Team sports are selected in an U12 category and it is very unlikely that a 10 year old student would be selected, with the exception of Rugby League. Rugby League selects students in U10, U11 and U12 categories due to the contact nature of the sport.
- Bundaberg District trials are not 'have a go' trials. St Patrick's has a responsibility for sending students who we feel display high ability in the chosen sport and a high level of behaviour.
- Students wishing to trial must have a consent form issued by the school with authorisation from Mr Plumb, Ms Gollshewsky or Annette Hammermeister. Students will not be able to participate in the trials without a *Bundaberg District Primary Schools nomination form*.
- · Cross Country and Athletics nominations will be made by the school after our school carnivals. Swimming & Aquathlon are the exceptions Wide Bay School Sport are responsible for the selection of these teams.


