# **Principal's News**

Reconciliation Week is all the more significant to us this year as we celebrate two significant anniversaries – 50 years since the 1967 Referendum and 25 years since the historic Mabo decision. The Reverend Glenn Loughrey is a Wiradjuri man and an Anglican minister and I enjoyed this reflection he shared in regard to Reconciliation.

During this National Reconciliation Week we have been thinking about the experience of exile shared by many of the indigenous people in this country. These are people whom have moved off country, found themselves powerless and homeless and have struggled with the challenge posed by the dominant consumer society.


Exile is not just an indigenous issue. It affects us all in some way or another. Most of our ancestors have come to this country from another place and culture. Many of us retain a connection to our past and, in a sense, are in exile. Our language refers to the challenge living in this country is – we have 'tamed' the land, 'battled' the elements, 'fought' the outbreaks of fire and 'survived' raging floods and devastating droughts. This is not a place we are comfortably at home with! We have wrested from this land our place in it and claim to have made it our own.

Each of us in our own way is living in exile, individually and culturally. The loss of place for those who were at home here, and the failure of those who took it from them to make it home, leaves us all in the same place, exile. Reconciliation, the action of coming together to make this country our country, requires us to deal honestly with the past, to acknowledge its failures and tragedies, and come together to build a future out of the ashes of exile. Exile, as we have noted previously can be the end or the beginning. It is up to us which it is going to be.


# **Screenagers**
