# ANAPHYLAXIS INFORMATION

During this term some students will be learning about food allergies and the risks associated with anaphylaxis. Anaphylaxis is a potentially life threatening, severe allergic reaction which must always be treated as a medical emergency. Having supportive teachers, friends and peers is an important part of risk minimisation.

Key messages provided to the students include:

- always take allergies seriously
- know what your friend or classmates are allergic to
- wash your hands after eating or touching food
- don't share your food with friends or classmates who have food allergies
- don't pressure your friends or classmates to eat or clean up food that they are allergic to
- if a friend or classmate with allergy becomes sick or unwell, get help from an adult immediately
- be respectful of student's adrenaline auto-injectors.

Efforts have been made to ensure all students are aware of the risks associated with anaphylaxis and the unacceptable dangers of teasing students with their allergens.

It would be appreciated if families could follow up with this important information at home.


If you have a current and valid government concession card, please present this to the finance secretary to receive your entitlement of 70% discount on tuition fees.
