This is a program that involves the input of information from parents, Leadership and of course classroom teachers. We have then spent hours in helping to generate classes which will be published next Friday, 1st December, along with your child's report card. We are confident that these are as close to 'perfectly balanced' as possible, when considering academic, behaviour and friendship connections. I thank you in advance for your co-operation, understanding and support around these matters, as it is no easy task but a beneficial venture to ensure the best possible start to a new year.

LAST DAY OF SCHOOL ARRANGEMENTS

On our last day of term, Friday 1st December from 9am we will hold our End of Year Liturgy. Students will then return to their class for a small snack and activities. The day will then end with a Year 6 Assembly from 11:10am-12pm, which will involve the whole school in the multi. At the conclusion of the assembly, all students will return to their classes for roll marking prior to being dismissed at 12pm. There will be no formal classes from 12pm-3pm. Parents are free and encouraged to collect their children at this time. From 12pm, teachers will be on gate duties at both Powers and Mulgrave Streets and our Pick-Up Zone will begin operation. Any student walking or riding home must have a note from their parents. We understand there may be circumstances where early pick-up may not be possible, and we thank families who have already used this Google link to register their children for care from 12pm-3pm. This will occur from the OSHC space under the supervision of Claire O'Connell and a teacher. We will have to close the link and finalise numbers, Monday 27th November, to ensure we have enough care in place. At 3pm the only pick-up zone in operation will be the Mulgrave St. carpark. The Powers Street gate will be locked and George Street only open for those requiring bus transport. There will be no Tuckshop on the last day or Sausage Sizzle and normal sports uniform must be worn by all students. PARENTAL CONSENTS

As part of Catholic Education Diocese of Rockhampton, St Patrick's has as its highest priority the safety and well-being of our students. One of our key processes for upholding student protection is seeking up-to-date parental consents to inform how we share student images and information in accordance with parent directives. In order to achieve this we have introduced an online consent system via Parent Lounge to enable parents to update consents at any time.

Some parents may have received an email this week asking to login to <u>Parent Lounge</u> and update consents for your child/ren. Note if you have more than one child, this update will need to be completed for each child.

Please note the following descriptions for the five consent areas:-

Promo, Website, Ext Display – refers to external displays, website and promotional material for the school, CEDR and the Queensland Catholic Education Commission.

Social Media – refers to Facebook for the school, CEDR and the Queensland Catholic Education Commission.

In local, regional, state, and national media - refers to outlets representing the school.

Sharing my/our personal information (limited to name, address, telephone numbers, occupation) – refers to sharing information to its associated supporting groups such as the P&F, sporting and cultural support groups.

Disclosing data with ACARA – refers to the school disclosing information to the Australian Curriculum Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) such as gender, date of birth, country of birth, background language, residential address, parental occupation, and parental education. The information provided is anonymous and will be used in formulating national reports consisting of aggregated data on school performance and assisting government to formulate policies in relation to education matters. CEDR encourages parents to provide this information as the exclusion of data could result in reduced funding for St Patrick's.

Thank you in advance for assisting us in enhancing our student protection processes. If consents are not updated by the end of the term, please note consents for your child/ren will be defaulted to No. Please contact the office if you require any assistance.
