

PERSONALISED LEARNING


Personalised Learning refers to various learning experiences, instructional approaches and academic support strategies intended to address the distinct learning needs, interests and aspirations of each student. Instruction is flexible and tailored to each student.

In Year 5, teachers plan collaboratively using the Australian Curriculum. We use learning intentions (what children are learning) and success criteria (how children will know they are successful in achieving learning goals) to ensure that all Year 5 classes are simultaneously exposed to the same content.


IPADS

- > iPads will be used daily.
- > Please ensure your child's school iPad is fully charged every morning.
- Students will use keyboards to assist with longer typing tasks. These are provided by the school.
- > Headphones are required each day as we
 - > use these in conjunction with iPads.

HOMEWORK



- Reading is the core focus. As reading is crucial for your child's education, we ask that you encourage your child to read each night.
- Other homework that is given in Year 5 includes Spelling and Mathematics. These homework tasks are <u>optional</u>, not compulsory.
- Spelling: These are words that are being focused on in class. These words will be assessed each Friday.
- Mathematics: This will consist of general number facts and problems to consolidate students' understanding of number.
