Dad had been unwell, but nothing really prepares you for the loss of a parent, as far too many of you would know. In preparing Dad's eulogy, I was reminded of the words etched into Mary MacKillop's tomb 'remember, we are but travellers here'. Dad started from humble beginnings, but was in hindsight a motivated and driven person, forever setting goals and achieving them. As I reflected on Dad's life journey, I noticed that his goals were realised early in life. As soon as orders are dispatched to us, we will then send home with your child.



At this concert, the groups will celebrate their senior cohort who have been valued members of the music community at Shalom since 2019.






