# PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

## 21 April 2023

The last Newsletter I wrote, found my thoughts firmly planted in the Lenten season, as we prepared for Easter. Easter is the most symbolic event on the Christian calendar and a significant act of God, in the living memory of human history. This sequence of events is very much part of our identity, as a community of those who believe in the 'Son of God' being sent on a self-sacrificing mission, for the betterment of humanity.

Weeks later, we now prepare for another significant time of ceremony, which is often linked to a National Identity encompassing mateship, teamwork, courage and resilience. When we consider the self-sacrifice made by soldiers on the beaches of Gallipoli, for freedoms enjoyed today, it is tempting to make parallels between the two historical recounts. They are, however, vastly different in context. What I do like to draw from these two stories though, is the hope and resurrection often born from times of crucifixion, despair and defeat. This can conjure in us a strength when we find ourselves carrying our own cross or burdens, which weigh us down to a point where it would be easier to give up. These are rich in tradition and carry important messages worthy of being passed on to the next generation.

Easter Sunday, at Bargara, there was not a seat left in the humble church of St. James. Christmas time, the same issue experienced, when there was only standing room at Holy Rosary. We would welcome the same problem during the term, but it is affirming to see that families are still very keen to keep traditions alive in a way that reflects the need to show ones' respect and gratefulness at these significant times of the year. This will hopefully be true of our ANZAC DAY march next Tuesday, 25<sup>th</sup> April, where we will assemble from 8am on Bourbong Street, between Tantitha and Targo Streets near Stag Hairdressers.

Students are asked to wear their sports uniform with formal school hat and apply sunscreen before attending. Please make sure students are well hydrated and consider bringing a water bottle. The march will commence at 8:30 and will go along Bourbong Street, past the Cenotaph and continue down Bourbong Street into Buss Park. Once we arrive at Buss Park, somewhere just after 9:00am, we will take students from Prep to Year 5 to the front of the Anglican Church on Woongarra Street. We would ask that parents collect their children from this position, as soon as the march itself concludes. We really appreciate our younger children being part of this event, so we are not asking these children to stay for the whole ceremony - only the march itself. All children must remain with teachers, until they are collected by a parent.

Our Year Six students will stay for the ceremony as the mature leaders of our school. They understand the significance of ANZAC Day and will represent our school well. This part of the ceremony will be completed no later than 10:00am.

Each year there are fewer veterans marching out front and they draw hope that their legacy will continue through the school students that attend to show their 'respect and gratefulness'. It is a wonderful opportunity for St. Patrick's to stand proudly, shoulder to shoulder, as we partake in this worthwhile community event.


