Last long weekend, I was heartened to see so many people out enjoying the outdoors. It reminded me how grateful I am to live in our beautiful country and of the shared responsibility we all hold to shape it with justice, compassion, and hope.

Australia Day is viewed through many different lenses, yet it always invites reflection on our evolving national identity and the values we choose to live by, as we journey together. This reflection feels especially significant as we return from the holiday season, still touched by the recent events that unfolded at Bondi.

Pope Leo has announced this year's theme: *"One in Christ, United in Mission."* We are reminded that hope is not passive—it is active, courageous, and deeply connected to what we believe.

Scripture reminds us that *"those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength"* (Isaiah 40:31). What we believe profoundly shapes how we act and respond when life presents challenges. In Jewish tradition, wisdom teaches that from darkness comes light—a truth echoed in our Christian faith. As we read in the Gospel of John: *"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it"* (John 1:5).

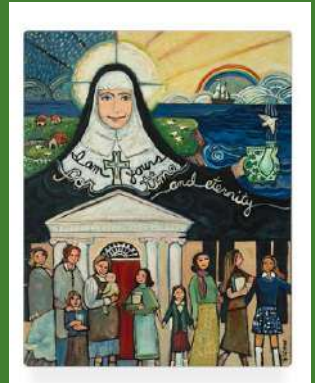

UNIFORM POLICY

A kind reminder below about our grooming and jewellery:

HAIR

- **All students**—Minimum cut is gauge 2 and no shorter. All hairstyles are to be natural in colour, conservative and graduated/blended in style. NO tracks, shaved patterns, mullets, 'horseys' and/or rat's tails are permitted. Part-line haircuts are acceptable with the fringe to be cut above the eyes.
- **Boys** hair is to be collar in length and short on sides. Styles to be worn off the face and the fringe to be cut above the eyes.
- **Girls** hair below shoulder length must be tied back with white, bottle green, white or black hair bands, ribbons, hair ties and clips. All styles must be worn off the face and the fringe to be cut above the eyes.

JEWELLERY

- Chain with cross or religious medallion under shirt/dress.
- Girls Earrings – one pair of studs or sleepers to be worn in the lobe of the ear (not permitted for boys).
- Additional body piercings are not permitted for any student. Culturally significant piercings must first be discussed with the Principal prior to procuring.
- Rings, bracelets and non-religious necklaces are not permitted.
- Make-up and nail polish are not permitted.

UNIFORM POLICY—SPORTS HATS



Please be reminded that the Sports Bucket Hats are only to be worn when your child wears their sports uniform and not to be worn with the formal uniform.

Prep students do not require Formal Hats this year.

SPORTS NEWS

BUNDABERG DISTRICT U12 SCHOOL SPORTS TRIALS—2025

Trial information will be advised in the school's newsletter each week detailing trial information for upcoming individual and team events.

Gaining selection in a Bundaberg District Team is the first step on the pathway to representing Wide Bay and Queensland. To represent Bundaberg District, students must be born 2014, 2015 & 2016 (only exceptional 10 year old students will be given permission to trial in team sports). The majority of team sport trials occur in February and March.

Please be aware of the following points:

- Team sports are selected in an U12 category and it is very unlikely that a 10 year old student would be selected, with the exception of Rugby League. Rugby League selects students in U10, U11 and U12 categories due to the contact nature of the sport.
- Bundaberg District trials are not 'have a go' trials. St Patrick's has a responsibility for sending students who we feel display high ability in the chosen sport and a high level of behaviour.
- Students wishing to trial must have a consent form issued by the school with authorisation from Mr Plumb, Ms Gollshewsky or Mr Egan. Students will not be able to participate in the trials without a ***Bundaberg District Primary Schools nomination form***.
- Cross Country and Athletics nominations will be made by the school after our school carnivals. Swimming & Aquathlon are the exceptions – Wide Bay School Sport are responsible for the selection of these teams.

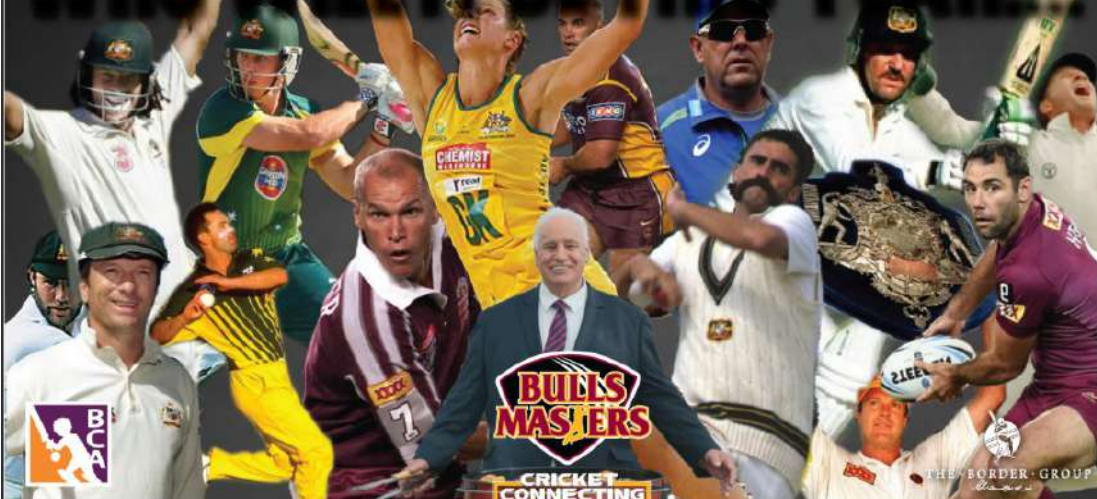
