PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

Communities of Faith, Hope and Love is once more the theme for Queensland's Catholic Education Week, 2023, to be celebrated next week. After working in each of the Bundaberg Catholic schools, I can honestly say I have witnessed *faith, hope and love* being developed and nurtured in the hearts of young people, across all four communities. The thread that connects each school is a shared Catholic identity underpinned by the 'Jesus Story' which 3B reminded us of this week, through their Courtyard Prayer. However, there's something very uniquely special about our own little piece of Catholic Education and we have so much to celebrate. The following examples jumped out at me over the past week.

Catholic Education Week is nicely wedged between Challenge Cup and Eisteddfod. Two platforms that give our students an opportunity to turn their God given talents into gifts. I was privileged to travel to Yeppoon last week to watch the Challenge Cup Rugby League and Netball Teams play their hearts out. At the opening ceremony Diocesan Director, Ms. Leesa Jeffcoat, challenged teams to 'be humble in winning and gracious in defeat' and both teams rose to the challenge and represented St. Patrick's so well. A big thank you to Matt Plumb, Cristian Zandona, Rachel Medley and Grace Whaleboat who prepared these teams in a manner that assisted these young people to shine, on and off the field/court. Thank you to the parents who travelled away with their children. They were such a supportive group and this was very much acknowledged and appreciated.



This week I have seen individuals slipping out for their Eisteddfod performances and next week our choirs and Instrumental Band will perform on the big stage. We wish them well and look forward to sharing some results in next week's newsletter. Thanks again to Kate Hardisty, Michael Goodall, Bernadette Connolly, Jed Morley and Adrian Brookes who work tirelessly with our musically inclined students.

Happily, students don't have to leave their classrooms to achieve success. I visited Year Three some time ago, when they were first delving in to their **TinkerCad** projects, an engineering program. Students had to choose an animal and create a scenario, involving a limb amputation. Students then had to draw on recent learning and knowledge to design a prosthetic limb. Last week the prosthetic limbs were realised through the 3D printing process and students fitted these to their chosen animal. I had students proudly share their work. The subject specific vocabulary they used to explain their creation reflected a high level of 21st century learning, but more importantly, they did so with such enthusiasm. FINANCE NEWS

A reminder to all families that fees have been issued and are payable by Friday 4th August unless you have a payment plan in place, in which case this merely serves as a statement for your records.

Upon receipt, please take time to review your invoice/statement and contact Finance Secretary, Brooke, if you have any queries or you wish to setup a payment plan.

Please make sure to check your junk box if think you haven't received your statement.

It is the responsibility of all parents to pay school fees when attending Catholic schools, your contribution through school fees is essential to the continued operation of our school. If you are having difficulty in paying school fees, please contact the finance secretary to discuss alternative arrangements.

Please see below school fee payment options that are available. Alternatively, payments can be made at the school by cash, cheque, EFTPOS, Mastercard or Visa Card.

Direct Deposit If you wish to pay by direct transfer from your bank account to ours, please ensure you use your parent code located at the top right corner of your statement as a reference. Our bank account details are noted at the bottom of your parent statement.

Recurring Credit Card Billing If you wish to make regular recurring payments as you would normally from a bank account but prefer to use a Credit Card so as to gain advantages of frequent flyer points etc., it is as simple as completing a form. This form is available on the school website under Fees and Charges in the Menu tab, titled Direct Debit by Credit Card Form. Otherwise please contact St Patrick's School Finance Secretary Brooke Bone at <u>brooke_bone@rok.catholic.edu.au</u> to have the form return e-mailed or call in to the office to have a printed copy provided.

BPay BPay is the electronic bill payment service offered by Australia's leading banks and financial institutions providing a convenient, fast and easy way for debtors to pay their bills anytime/anywhere through the security of your telephone or internet banking. A BPay logo with the school's biller id and account reference is on your statement, if you choose to pay this way.

Parent Lounge Simply login to the Parent Lounge Portal, select Make a Payment tab and follow the prompts to pay by credit card. An amount outstanding is automatically selected but you can amend this to pay a different amount.

Direct Debit If you wish to set up direct debit from your account on a periodic basis, please do not hesitate to contact Brooke Bone for assistance or simply download, complete and return the form titled Direct Debit by Bank Account Form available on the school website under Fees and Charges in the Menu tab.

<u>Centrepay</u> Login to your Centrelink through the MyGov website to setup periodic payments. Our CRN is 555 053 656K and use your parent code located at the top right corner of your statement as the reference.


