

PRINCIPAL'S NEWS 2nd May 2025

The term has started with short, sharp, yet eventful weeks which have left the heart (and calendar) full. Since our last newsletter we have commemorated ANZAC Day and the glorious celebration of Easter. I find myself reflecting on the profound themes of sacrifice, resurrection, and hope that both occasions embody. These moments in our calendar are not only significant historical and religious events, but also opportunities for us to come together as a community to honour, remember, and rejoice. Last week, visitors to our school commented on the respect and reverence shown by our students throughout Thursday's ANZAC DAY Prayer Service. This sense of commitment and community was then continued at the ANZAC DAY March on Friday. It was heart warming to see the large number of students, staff and parents who presented with hat, poppy or rosemary in hand to march in solidarity. Again, I received wonderful feedback and an acknowledgement of how our school continues to exude a commitment to passing on tradition and a culture that celebrates being a part of something bigger than ourselves. I guess you could say we spread the green all the way down Bourbong Street over the Public Holiday and for that we are very grateful. Thanks to all involved!

ANZAC Day, is a solemn reminder of the bravery, sacrifice, and unity demonstrated by the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps during World War I. It is a day to honour and remember all those who have served and continue to serve in our armed forces, safeguarding our freedoms and way of life. For me, I see it as a way to show appreciation to those shoulders we have climbed on, in order to enjoy the free existence we very much value in Bundaberg and Australia today. Values first born from the Easter story and Jesus' life sacrifice, through to the ANZACs and then those in our own lives that remind us never to take for granted the things that make our communities great places to grow and thrive. Over the past week we have lost two great examples of exemplary men who did this so well, in Pope Francis and Brother Lionel 'Ted' Magee.



Pope Francis will be remembered as a beacon of light for so many in our world, especially those most in need. He consistently emphasized how peace begins at home, urging people to foster reconciliation and understanding, describing the family as the 'wellspring of fraternity and the foundation for peace'. Lionel Magee was a Christian Brother, educator, but most known as a highly acclaimed College Principal and most recently for his work in our Bundaberg Catholic Parish. Lionel was Shalom Catholic College's Principal when I attended in its formative years. I remember Br. Magee as having a calm, charismatic and measured presence. I don't remember Br. Magee raising his voice often. This may have been because he had a way of being a step ahead. He had his finger on the pulse. He seemed to know what we were planning before we had a chance to put it in to action. Not only through the school day, but beyond. He had a way of nipping things in the bud. We rarely stepped out of line to avoid disappointing Brother. He invested so much time in our school and wanted us to respect ourselves and each other under the red, black and white ban-

ner. Shalom's mission statement mentions the importance of harnessing the enthusiasm of youth and this is definitely what Lionel and his team achieved. They looked for ways to engage us in Saint Vincent De Paul initiatives, including selling donated fruits and vegetables from the end of the Holy Rosary Church which later grew in to the Shalom Markets. Then, his love of the role that sport played in building character in young men and women. He was a great supporter of Confraternity Rugby League (QISSRL) which was originally born from Shalom College in the early days. The attached image shows Lionel presenting his Queensland Independent Secondary Schools Confraternity Carnival Team Jersey to Jonathan Thurston, of St. Mary's Toowoomba (and later NRL) at the 2000 carnival hosted by Shalom Catholic College. A great reminder of how such initiatives, turn young men and women in to the champions of our day. Brother Magee had big dreams and great 'hopes' for Shalom College which was at that time a blank canvas, a bare, fairly grassless space. He planted many seeds of hope. I am sure his 'hopes' were realised when he returned to Bundaberg to witness the College still thriving under the leadership of Principal and good friend, Dan McMahon and to know how integral the members of his family (Aplin/Hass families) had been in continuing to catapult the school forward and to see his own Nieces and Nephews attend. The funeral Mass for Br. Ted will be celebrated next Wednesday, 7th May at Holy Rosary Church, Bundaberg, commencing at 12:15pm.

### **Pope Francis**



Pope Francis, born Jorge Mario Bergoglio in Buenos Aires, Argentina, became the 266th pope of the Roman Catholic Church in 2013. He was the first pope from South America, the first Jesuit pope, and also the first to take the name Francis, choosing it in honour of St Francis of Assisi, a saint known for his simplicity, humility, and love for the poor. He was a voice for peace and compassion.

His leadership style was marked by a down-to-earth approach and a heart for those on the margins of society. Even though he held one of the most influential positions in the world, Pope Francis often chose a humble path, riding in simple cars, staying in modest rooms, and calling people personally to offer prayer and encouragement.

Pope Francis consistently spoke out for peace, justice, and care for the vulnerable. He encouraged believers to focus not just on tradition, but on living out the love of Christ in everyday life. He also reminded the world that faith without compassion means little, and that the Gospel calls us to serve others.

Throughout his papacy, he highlighted issues like poverty, the dignity of all people, and the importance of forgiveness. His words and actions inspired

millions of Christians around the world—Catholic and non-Catholic alike.

Pope Francis passed away on Easter Monday, just one day after Christians around the world celebrated the resurrection of Jesus. The timing is a powerful reminder of the hope we have in Christ. No matter our role or status in life, true purpose and peace are found in Him alone.

As we remember Pope Francis, we give thanks for a life lived in service to God. His legacy of humility and compassion will continue to inspire generations to come.

May 7 to be included in the presentation. We look forward to celebrating with all of the special la-

















As soon as orders are dispatched to us, we will then send home with your child.


### SPORTS NEWS
