### PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

### 7th February 2020

Relationships are always important to me and so I do make an effort to learn the names of all of our students. On occasion I mix up names, particularly with siblings, where for example, I may call a female student by the name of her older or younger sister. I have always forgiven myself for this – thinking I was pretty close – but I won't in the future.

You see earlier in the week, I put my head into a Year Three classroom, and talked to a few students by name. One of the girls stopped her work, looked at me, and asked, "Mr Fox do you have any brothers?" I replied that I did in fact have a brother.

"What's his name?" she asked politely. I responded that my brother's name was Rodney, wondering where this conversation could possibly be heading.

"Well," she replied, "from now on I might call you Rodney....because YOU ALWAYS CALL ME BY MY SISTER'S NAME!"

I have to admit it was one of the smoothest, well-executed take downs I've ever experienced – and I deserved it. It did sting a little, and yet it reminded me powerfully that our students look up to me and to the staff of our school and it is vitally important that they know in return that they are loved, valued and respected. It was excellent feedback – and I'll definitely remember it.

Grant Hackett would say even as one of the world's best swimmers, his coach would give him feedback every single day. Sometimes it was harshly delivered, and sometimes it hurt to hear, but Hackett would say he never ever resented it. He wanted feedback. He needed it if he was to be his absolute best and he knew his coach only ever had his absolute best interests at heart. Any feedback given was solely directed at making him a better swimmer and a better person.

As parents and teachers we often find ourselves in the same coaching position. We see aspects of our children's learning and character development which we know we should correct, but we fear to hurt feelings. I think if children know we love and respect them, and that our motivation lies only in what's best for them, they learn to accept and even welcome feedback. If people like Ash Barty and Nadal need coaches to encourage and correct them daily, surely our children do too.

### **ADMINISTRATION CARPARK**

### BUNDABERG DISTRICT U12 SCHOOL SPORTS TRIALS-2020

Trial information will be advised in the school's newsletter each week detailing trial information for upcoming individual and team events. Students will also be informed on Parade. Gaining selection in a Bundaberg District Team is the first step on the pathway to representing Wide Bay and Queensland. To represent Bundaberg District, students must be born 2008, 2009 & 2010 (only exceptional 10 year old students will be given permission to trial in team sports). The majority of team sport trials occur in February and March.

Please be aware of the following points:

- No student born 2007 is eligible to trial.
- Team sports are selected in an U12 category and it is very unlikely that a 10 year old student would be selected, with the exception of Rugby League. Rugby League selects in U10, U11 and U12 categories due to the contact nature of the sport.
- Bundaberg District trials are not 'have a go' trials. St Patrick's has a responsibility for sending students who we feel display high ability in the chosen sport and a high level of behaviour.
- Students wishing to trial must have a consent form issued by the school with authorisation from Mr Plumb, Ms Gollshewsky or Annette Hammermeister. Students will not be able participate in the trials without a *Bundaberg District Primary Schools nomination form*.
- Cross Country and Athletics nominations will be made by the school after our school carnivals. Swimming & Aquathlon are the exceptions Wide Bay School Sport are responsible for the selection of these teams.




