

### PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

7th February 2025

This week Years 2-6 celebrated our opening school Mass. Father John shared the following words as part of the Gospel from Mark 10: 13-16.

"Let the children come to me! Don't try to stop them. People who are like these little children belong to the kingdom of God.

I promise you that you cannot get into God's kingdom, unless you accept it the way a child does."

These words resonated with me, as the best examples of humanity are often found in the youngest of our students. Last week you may have read how we started taking notice of the little 'Mercy Moments' that are unfolding in our community, as a way of reinforcing what 'spreading the green' means at St. Patrick's School as we continue to 'seek higher things'. Teachers and students alike have been taking the time to share 'Mercy Moments' with attention firmly focussed on the Mercy Education value of Hospitality. The unexpected bi-product has been a great wave of gratefulness, as our attention has been firmly focussed on the strengths our young people exude. I think this is the message Jesus was trying to give us in this reading. How naturally attuned children can be to care for others and to look at the world around them through a lens of wonder and awe. On assembly, Leo B was identified as a young man who stopped a game of soccer to ensure the safety of an injured player, whilst Matilda K from Prep was named as a young lady who showed hospitality in supporting Prep friends that were still finding mornings difficult.

Staff recently discussed how sometimes we are afforded a rich sense of hospitality and mercy from total strangers. When we started sharing examples, many realised they were speaking of the same person. A lovely lady called 'Liv' from King Kong sales. This lady managed to remember many of our staff and always mentioned something she liked about them or their outfit, each time they visited. This was an excellent example of someone who knew the value of making visitors feel welcome and noticed. This week, St. Patrick's and Anastasi Blooms sent her a posy of flowers identifying the impact her simple act of kindness had on our community. She was very gracious and said the flowers had reached her on a day when she needed some words of encour-

agement herself, which highlighted how important it is to take time to acknowledge the 'Mercy Moments' that make our life journey a whole lot 'greener'.

Tickets have been released for the Catholic Education Race Day which will occur on the 15th of March, 2025. This has not only been a great fundraiser for our Catholic Schools over the past 20 years, but a great way for our school communities to stand in solidarity under the banner of Catholic Education. ### **Our Mercy Charism**




This term we will meet in Week 4, 6, 8 and 10!



### OTHER UNIFORM POLICY

A kind reminder below about our grooming and jewellery:

#### **HAIR**

- <u>All students</u>—Minimum cut is gauge 2 and no shorter. All hairstyles are to be natural in colour, conservative and graduated/blended in style. NO tracks, shaved patterns, mullets, 'horseys' and/or rat's tails are permitted. Part-line haircuts are acceptable with the fringe to be cut above the eyes.
- <u>Boys</u> hair is to be collar in length and short on sides. Styles to be worn off the face and the fringe to be cut above the eyes.
- Girls hair below shoulder length must be tied back with white, bottle green or black hair bands, ribbons, hair ties and clips. All styles must be worn off the face and the fringe to be cut above the eyes.

### **JEWELLERY**

- Chain with cross or religious medallion under shirt/dress.
- Girls Earrings one pair of studs or sleepers to be worn in the lobe of the ear (not permitted for boys).
- Additional body piercings are not permitted for any student. Culturally significant piercings must first be discussed with the Principal prior to procuring.
- Rings, bracelets and non-religious necklaces are not permitted.
- Make-up and nail polish are not permitted.

### **BUNDABERG DISTRICT U12 SCHOOL SPORTS TRIALS-2025**

Trial information will be advised in the school's newsletter each week detailing trial information for upcoming individual and team events.

Gaining selection in a Bundaberg District Team is the first step on the pathway to representing Wide Bay and Queensland. To represent Bundaberg District, students must be born 2013, 2014 & 2015 (only exceptional 10 year old students will be given permission to trial in team sports). The majority of team sport trials occur in February and March.

Please be aware of the following points:

- Team sports are selected in an U12 category and it is very unlikely that a 10 year old student would be selected, with the exception of Rugby League. Rugby League selects students in U10, U11 and U12 categories due to the contact nature of the sport.
- Bundaberg District trials are not 'have a go' trials. St Patrick's has a responsibility for sending students who we feel display high ability in the chosen sport and a high level of behaviour.
- Students wishing to trial must have a consent form issued by the school with authorisation from Mr Plumb, Ms Gollshewsky or Mr Egan. Students will not be able to participate in the trials without a *Bundaberg District Primary* Schools nomination form.
- · Cross Country and Athletics nominations will be made by the school after our school carnivals. Swimming & Aquathlon are the exceptions Wide Bay School Sport are responsible for the selection of these teams.
