


PRINCIPAL'S NEWS 20 October 2023

The first time we gathered as a staff this year. When the year was young and I was new. I asked the following question....



The first response might be a black dot. As human beings, like a moth to light, we are so often drawn to the small black dot in our relationships, in our work place, in our community and most certainly in ourselves. This often results in us ignoring the large area of white that surrounds the small blemish.

I asked staff, students and the Board to add their 'white canvas' observation of this community. This activity had dual-purpose. Firstly, to give me a clear understanding of what the community valued. Secondly, to have a visual cue hanging in our staffroom, as a reminder of all the positive things we have to celebrate. Now that we are in the throws of our final term. A time when fatigue may start to set in. A time when we may be drawn more easily to the small black dot, I thought it might be timely to share the white canvas with the broader community.

On Monday we had well over 100 parents plus their children join us for our 2024 Prep Orientation. I shared this analogy, making parallels between the white canvas and the impact I hoped Catholic Education would have on their children.



The quote from John (14:6) caught my attention on Sunday when I was perusing the Church Bulletin 'The Way, The Truth and **The Light'**. White reflects more light than colours and this is what I think we hope for our young people. Year 2C, at Courtyard Prayer this week, reminded us of how well Jesus modelled this to us in sharing the song 'Jesus is our light'. He saw the good in all people and his story still inspires so many to be hopeful, grateful and mindful, as we journey through life. He not only turned water to wine, but so often lemons in to lemonade. A skill, that takes time and consideration to develop. I find the 'black dot' less of a temptation, on the mornings that our young ones lead us in prayer and I am grateful for that opportunity.


SPORTS NEWS
