#### What is Our Catholic Identity - and is it at the Heart of Our School?

Our goal is not to hold onto the past for its own sake, but to ensure that our Catholic faith remains alive, relevant, and deeply rooted in the everyday life of the school.

Through this process of reflection, we are reminded that Catholic Identity is not static - it is something we grow into as a community. Whether through prayer, liturgy, social justice initiatives, learning experiences, or relationships, we are continually shaping what it means to be a Catholic school in a changing world.

So, is our Catholic Identity at the heart of our school?

Yes - when we live with compassion, seek truth, dialogue, include others, and act justly, we bring our Catholic identity to life. Let us continue to nurture a school where we not only learn about faith, but truly experience it - where everyone is welcomed, challenged, and inspired to live out the Gospel each day.


