PRINCIPAL'S NEWS 2nd August 2019

Yesterday I was tasked with taking our Senior Choir to the Moncrieff and collecting our Junior Choir to return them to school. To say the students were excited would be a massive understatement, and clearly the adrenalin of performing was still working its way through.

After settling the students and counting heads for the 50th time, I was already mentally preparing for some conversations I needed to have, and thinking on other matters from yesterday that I could have better handled, when Sadie from Year 2 politely asked if I'd like to sit with her for the trip home.

I gratefully accepted the kind invitation, and spent the trip home avidly listening to Sadie's very detailed recount of the performance, her transition from nervousness to excitement and how much fun it all was. I loved the trip home. I realized what an amazing experience this was for Sadie and her excitement was absolutely infectious. Sadie was clearly in the moment during her performance and she simply wanted to share the joy that the experience had been for her.

This morning, I had the opportunity to watch the Junior Strings perform. Performances at this age are typically short, and the absolute focus these young students displayed was amazing. Parents who were there were equally intent on the brief performance of their child. Both students and parents were absolutely in the moment, and you could sense the pride of the performers in what they were able to achieve, through this intense focus.

Those of you who are cricket fans would enjoy listening to Justin Langer speak. He talks about the way he learned and practised meditation. Over time, he learned to focus completely on the way the ball left the bowlers' hand - nothing else. He managed to cut out thoughts about the crowd, the match, what would happen to his career if he got out, or even where he would hit the ball. Just the ball leaving the bowlers' hand. He would point to this as the turning point in his career as a batsman.

The older I get, the more convinced I am that the key to both happiness and success, is that ability to be fully present in the moment. Perhaps as we reflect on all that is Catholic Education, we could learn from our kids that importance of being fully present in the moment.



FINANCE NEWS

Fees were issued 24th July and are due for payment 7th August **unless you have a payment plan in place**. If you have a regular payment plan in place this merely serves as a statement for your records. Take time to review your statement and make immediate payment of any outstanding fees if necessary. With our most recent system update creating issues with emails heading to junk boxes, a reminder to please check your junk box if think you haven't received your statement.

It is the responsibility of all parents to pay school fees when attending Catholic schools. Your contribution through school fees is essential to the continued operation of your Catholic school. Any shortfall in assessed fees for the year has to be met from the general school account which could mean less in our budget to meet our commitments. If you are having difficulty in paying school fees, please contact the finance secretary to discuss alternative arrangements.

SCHOOL FEE PAYMENT OPTIONS—Payments can be made at the school by cash, cheque, EFTPOS, Mastercard or Visa Card.

<u>Direct Deposit</u> - If you wish to pay by direct transfer from your bank account to ours, please ensure you use your parent code located at the top right corner of your statement as a reference. Our bank account details are noted at the bottom of your parent statement.

Recurring Credit Card Billing—If you wish to make regular recurring payments as you would normally from a bank account but prefer to use a Credit Card so as to gain advantages of frequent flyer points etc., it is as simple as completing a form. This form is available on the school website under Fees and Charges in the Menu tab, titled Direct Debit by Credit Card Form. Otherwise please contact St Patrick's School Finance Secretary Maria Davies at maria-davies@rok.catholic.edu.au to have the form return e-mailed or call in to the office to have a printed copy provided.

<u>BPay</u>—BPay is the electronic bill payment service offered by Australia's leading banks and financial institutions providing a convenient, fast and easy way for debtors to pay their bills anytime/anywhere through the security of your telephone or internet banking. A BPay logo with the school's biller id and account reference is on your statement, if you choose to pay this way.

<u>Parent Lounge</u> - Simply login to the Parent Lounge Portal, select Make a Payment tab and follow the prompts to pay by credit card. An amount outstanding is automatically selected but you can amend this to pay a different amount.

<u>Direct Debit</u> - If you wish to set up direct debit from your account on a periodic basis, please do not hesitate to contact Maria Davies for assistance or simply download, complete and return the form titled Direct Debit by Bank Account Form available on the school website under Fees and Charges in the Menu tab.

<u>Centrepay—</u>Login to your Centrelink through the MyGov website to setup periodic payments.
