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PRINCIPAL'S NEWS 12th February 2021

One afternoon this week I was waiting with the last few kids to be collected. I noticed one little guy with his shoelaces untied and suggested he tie them while waiting for his parents. He explained that he hadn't yet mastered the knot. While looking at his big brother Koby, I replied that he was lucky to have a big brother who I was sure would tie his shoelaces for him. I heard Koby mutter under his breath as I moved away. Fair enough – there are only so many times you want to tie your brother's shoelaces.

A few minutes later when I returned, I found something I didn't expect. Koby was delivering a really good lesson on shoelace tying. He was demonstrating the process - talking it through slowly and patiently. He encouraged his little brother the whole time and had the little brother's complete attention. It was something both boys knew needed to be learned.

I was really impressed. Koby had a choice. He could continue to tie his brother's shoelaces – or take the time to enable his little brother to do it for himself. Pretty mature for a ten year old.

How many times do we as parents, do things for our kids just because we're in a hurry. If we always do it for them, there is little chance they will bother learning to do it for themselves. Koby's little brother will soon be looking after his own shoelaces.

Guiding our children to learn good habits is essential. You'd be surprised how quickly our Prep kids learn to clean up their area at lunch time or put toys away at pack-up times. It simply becomes what you do. We would encourage parents to do the same with reading. Make reading with your children a nightly routine. Make it enjoyable, and it will quickly become a habit. Once established as a habit, over time you will see children read for longer periods and with more challenging texts. Once the habit is established, it is easy to build upon.

BUNDABERG DISTRICT U12 SCHOOL SPORTS TRIALS—2021

Trial information will be advised in the school's newsletter each week detailing trial information for upcoming individual and team events. Students will also be informed on Parade. Gaining selection in a Bundaberg District Team is the first step on the pathway to representing Wide Bay and Queensland. To represent Bundaberg District, students must be born 2009, 2010 & 2011 (only exceptional 10 year old students will be given permission to trial in team sports). The majority of team sport trials occur in February and March.

Please be aware of the following points:

- · No student born 2008 is eligible to trial.
- Team sports are selected in an U12 category and it is very unlikely that a 10 year old student would be selected, with the exception of Rugby League. Rugby League selects in U10, U11 and U12 categories due to the contact nature of the sport.
- Bundaberg District trials are not 'have a go' trials. St Patrick's has a responsibility for sending students who we feel display high ability in the chosen sport and a high level of behaviour.
- Students wishing to trial must have a consent form issued by the school with authorisation from Mr Plumb, Ms Gollshewsky or Annette Hammermeister. Students will not be able to participate in the trials without a *Bundaberg District Primary Schools nomination form*.
- · Cross Country and Athletics nominations will be made by the school after our school carnivals. Swimming & Aquathlon are the exceptions Wide Bay School Sport are responsible for the selection of these teams.

SWIMMING

Nominations close 3:00 pm 17 February. Nominations to be returned to Ms. Gollshewsky via the school office.

Selection in the Wide Bay Regional Team is gained by submitting times swum in the 50 metre pool in a QSA sanctioned meet. When times are submitted, they must be verified by printouts from Meet Manager and then stamped and signed by the club's secretary or record keeper. If this procedure is not followed, times will not be accepted.

NOTE: Due to COVID-19 restrictions and concerns while attending swim meets, and the cancellation of some swim meets it has been decided to extend the time frame that times can be submitted for consideration. **Swimmers can now nominate times from January 2020 until 19 February 2021** rather than just the current swimming season.

Regional selections will be based on results (times) from District carnivals for 50-metre events **OR** Times recorded at a QSA sanctioned meet in a 50m pool from **January 2020 to the close of nominations on Friday 19 February 2021. These times will be considered for selection due to COVID restrictions.**

Friday Sausage Sizzle is held every Friday. If your child would like Sausage Sizzle on a Friday, simply send in \$2 per sausage and provide to your classroom teacher.

To ensure the correct number of sausages are cooked, please remember to provide the required money to your child **prior to school commencing**. Late orders may not be included in the total tally after 9am.





FINANCE NEWS

Welcome to the 2021 school year. A reminder to all families that fees have now been issued and are payable within 14 days unless you have a payment plan in place, in which case they merely serve as a statement for your records. Upon receipt, please take time to review your invoice/statement and contact Finance Secretary Maria Davies if you have any queries or any time should you wish to setup a payment plan. Please check your junk box if think you haven't received your statement.

It is the responsibility of all parents to pay school fees when attending Catholic schools. Your contribution through school fees is essential to the continued operation of your Catholic school. Any shortfall in assessed fees for the year has to be met from the general school account which could mean less in our budget to meet our commitments. If you are having difficulty in paying school fees, please contact the finance secretary to discuss alternative arrangements.

To ensure you are being billed correctly, if you haven't already done so, please login to parent lounge to complete the Confirmation of Enrolment Form. One form per family is required and is issued in the name of the eldest child in the family. Confirmation of Enrolment Form is not only used to ensure your children a place at St Patrick's but it ensures you will receive discounts if you have more than one child at a Catholic School or College in the Diocese of Rockhampton and it also directs your payment plan selections and any concessional allowance.

This is the first year this form has been digitalised and feedback has been positive with a minor challenge being not everybody has clicked on the small globe to access and complete the form...please follow the three step process outlined below.

SCHOOL FEE PAYMENT OPTIONS



Payments can be made at the school by cash, cheque, EFTPOS, Mastercard or Visa Card.

Direct Deposit

If you wish to pay by direct transfer from your bank account to ours, please ensure you use your parent code located at the top right corner of your statement as a reference. Our bank account details are noted at the bottom of your parent statement.

Recurring Credit Card Billing

If you wish to make regular recurring payments as you would normally from a bank account but prefer to use a Credit Card so as to gain advantages of frequent flyer points etc., it is as simple as completing a form. This form is available on the school website under Fees and Charges in the Menu tab, titled Direct Debit by Credit Card Form. Otherwise please contact St Patrick's School Finance Secretary Maria Davies at maria_davies@rok.catholic.edu.au to have the form return e-mailed or call in to the office to have a printed copy provided.

BPay

BPay is the electronic bill payment service offered by Australia's leading banks and financial institutions providing a convenient, fast and easy way for debtors to pay their bills anytime/anywhere through the security of your telephone or internet banking. A BPay logo with the school's biller id and account reference is on your statement, if you choose to pay this way.

Parent Lounge

Simply login to the Parent Lounge Portal, select Make a Payment tab and follow the prompts to pay by credit card. An amount outstanding is automatically selected but you can amend this to pay a different amount.

Direct Debit

If you wish to set up direct debit from your account on a periodic basis, please do not hesitate to contact Maria Davies for assistance or simply download, complete and return the form titled Direct Debit by Bank Account Form available on the school website under Fees and Charges in the Menu tab.

Centrepay

Login to your Centrelink through the MyGov website to setup periodic payments. Our CRN is 555 053 656K and use your parent code located at the top right corner of your statement as the reference.
