This week Year 4M lead prayer and a song which went something like 'we are good friends all the time... Jesus is our good friend'. On Thursday I expressed how the lyrics of this song called me to consider how hard it is to be a good friend 100% of the time. Even harder as a young person who is trying to learn how to be a friend and make friends. Human relationships are complicated and inevitably conflict is encountered, as a normal part of life. As the song suggests, Jesus certainly was a great role model for how to be a loyal, steadfast friend. We are forever grateful that we have this example to hinge our values on. I did suggest to the students that Jesus didn't always agree with his closest friends and challenged them to be better versions of themselves from time to time. A great example is when he reached out to Zacchaeus, a tax collector who was disliked by many. Zacchaeus then changed and became a better version of himself, as a result of his relationship with Jesus. Yesterday we had Director Michael McCusker visit us for the first time in his new role. He had a wonderful morning with us and commented on the wonderful sense of calm he experienced as he walked throughout our school. Every community has its challenges and schools are often messy, but I have to agree that we have a pretty special place in space, thanks to the relationships forged between students, staff and families.



Students gifted Director McCusker with some gifts and tips to help him navigate his way around St. Patrick's. A green tie was to remind him to 'spread the green'. Younger students explained what this might mean; looking out for those who are down or unwell, good sports, asking people to play when lonely, being kind and generally helping ourselves and others, to remain in the green zone of regulation which is so integral for learning. Again, not always easy, but something we continually work to achieve. Students also presented Mr. McCusker a St. Patrick's handball, suggesting how to fit in, he may just want to brush up on his skills and a warning that 'spreading the green' is most important (and challenging) when engaging in competitive sport. This was a challenge well-received by Director McCusker and we look forward to welcoming him back to St. Patrick's again into the near future.
