Principal's News

I love school and how involved we are in the lives of our students and their families. Finance News



Term 4 fees were issued 16th October and are payable 30th October unless you have a payment plan in place. In order to keep St Patrick's Catholic Primary School fees to a minimum, it is imperative that all of our accounts are paid on time. If you do not have a payment plan in place or have not yet made payment, please settle your account by due date or contact the finance secretary if you are unable to make payment at this time and to establish a payment plan.

Statements serve as a tax invoice payable by a due date if you do not have a payment plan in place or merely as a statement if you do have a payment plan in place which then reflects what payments are being receipted and what charges you have incurred. Please take time to check your statements when they are issued to ensure your account is correct and query any discrepancies you may have. Contact the finance secretary at spbg_finance@rok.catholic.edu.au if you have not received your statement or if you have any queries regarding your account. Remember to ensure all contact details for receiving statements are up to date – you can make changes or update your contact details via parent lounge.

A reminder that if you hold an eligible means tested Health Care or Pensioner card you are entitled to a discount on tuition fees. If you are an eligible cardholder, please present your card to the Finance Secretary in the office for processing. 2018 FEES

Now is the time to establish a payment plan for 2018 fees. For your information and convenience, the 2018 Fee Schedule and Direct Debit forms can be found on the school's website. A reminder that direct debit plans do not carry forward automatically – you are required to complete a new form.

Curriculum News

Booklists and Apps Lists

Booklists and App lists will be sent home in the next few weeks. Please note that our iPad requirements for 2018 have changed. iPads are an optional device for Prep to Year 2. Children in Year 3 – 6 must bring a 5th Gen or newer iOS compatible iPad with a minimum of 32Gb storage. Ideally children will have 64Gb storage or more to ensure longevity of the device. Extra storage means there is space for non-school related Apps and games that parents may allow children to download. School Apps and school work must take priority over games and other Apps. If storage space for school work becomes limited, children will be asked to delete these extra Apps.

Performing students will not require a ticket


