#### PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

This week I witnessed a special delivery from a parent, for the teachers of her/his child's class. In the card, it expressed sincere gratitude for 'creating a rich learning environment....hands-on activities, and positive relationships' this school year, noting how 'patient, compassionate and understanding these teachers have been despite 'teaching being a challenging profession'. The same week, I received a thank you e-mail, listing all the activities another parent's child/ren had participated in, already this term. I was asked to pass on this family's 'gratitude' to the staff that 'value-add' by making these opportunities possible.

The first parent was right. Teaching is a challenging career. You don't have to go far to find news of a national teaching shortage, with 40% of teachers allegedly leaving in their first 5 years. However, challenge is not something new and is encountered in most lines of work, in this modern day. Taylor (2022) would suggest this is largely due to teachers feeling unappreciated. We have been very lucky at St. Patrick's. We are yet to experience the full wrath of a teacher shortage and our teachers have been in the profession for much longer than five years. Last week, we encouraged staff to take a card of 'gratitude' (provided) to acknowledge someone in our community that has made a difference to their working life. I am sure you could think of someone in your work family that could do with a sprinkle of positivity this week, as the same can be said for all work environments. However, there is one job that far outweighs all professions when it comes to degrees of difficulty and that is PARENTING! You may not always feel appreciated but, like teaching, it is one of the most rewarding encounters you will ever have the privilege to do. #### **CELEBRATING 150 YEARS!**

#### The Sisters of Mercy in the Rockhampton Diocese, Queensland 4 August 1873 – 4 August 2023

St Patrick's was originally opened and staffed by the Sisters of Mercy. The Sisters of Mercy were founded by Catherine McAuley. This year marks 150 years of the Mercy Sisters in our Diocese, below is some interesting information adapted from the writing of Joanne Molloy.

Mother Mary Vincent Whitty, in whom Catherine McAuley had placed great trust, lead the first Sisters of Mercy from Dublin, Ireland, to Brisbane in May 1861. Many requests were made of the Sisters after their arrival but it was impossible to meet the needs of the people, so widely scattered over the state. In 1869, Mother M Vincent returned to Ireland on a recruiting mission and returned to Brisbane with thirty new postulants. The tenacious and assertive Mother M Vincent was now in a position to establish more communities of Sisters and works of Mercy.

Seven Sisters of Mercy arrived in Rockhampton on 4th August 1873 after a sea journey on the 'Lady Bowen' along the Queensland coast from Brisbane. The shipping manifest listed the names of just several sisters and then made reference to "A quantity of extra luggage, Sisters of Mercy".




Faithful to the mission entrusted to them, the early Sisters frequently lived in harsh conditions and endured great hardships but they were continually motivated by the spirit of Catherine McAuley. Catherine had utmost faith in the Providence of God and these Sisters followed her example, frequently relying on the goodness and generosity of local people who are now part of our Mercy story. On July 10, 1897, five Sisters of Mercy came to Bundaberg to take up teaching duties.

## ADMINISTRATION NEWS




If your child/ren is/are dropped early, they are required to sit on the seats on the raised area outside of Prep S and await the teachers on duty who will then take students to play at 8:15am.

#### CURRICULUM NEWS-NAPLAN 2023

Individual student NAPLAN reports for Year 3 and 5 students will soon be distributed. The reporting process and format has changed significantly in 2023 with a summary of the key changes outlined below.

From 2023, NAPLAN results are reported against four proficiency standards to help provide clear information on how students are performing against challenging but reasonable standards of literacy and numeracy at the time of testing. The four proficiency levels for each NAPLAN domain at each year level are as follows:



- Exceeding: the student's result exceeds expectations at the time of testing.
- Strong: the student's result meets challenging but reasonable expectations at the time of testing.
- Developing: the student's result indicates that they are working towards expectations at the time of testing.
- **Needs additional support**: the student's result indicates that they are not achieving the learning outcomes expected at the time of testing. They are likely to need additional support to progress satisfactorily.

Accompanying your child's NAPLAN individual student report, you will find a parent information sheet. This document is a valuable resource containing important details about the new proficiency standards and how test results can help teachers and parents identify strengths and areas where your child may need further assistance.

Should you have any concerns regarding your child's results or wish to discuss them in detail, we encourage you to reach out to your child's teacher. They will be your primary point of contact and can provide valuable insights and support.
