WELCOME BACK PARKER KAANDORP YEAR 2

We are very excited to have Parker join us back at school. He has been away for medical treatment, and he will return with us in a part time capacity from next week. We do need your help and support. For a time Parker will be immunosuppressed meaning that his immunity will be lower and his body will not be able to fight infections in the normal way. Your children are not at any risk because of Parker's condition.

Viruses that cause measles, chickenpox and shingles could make Parker extremely unwell. For this reason, please contact the school immediately if your child contracts one of these illnesses. If we know that there has been exposure to measles, chickenpox or shingles, medicine can be immediately given to Parker in order to lessen the side effect of such an infection. This medicine does need to be given as soon as possible after the contact has taken place.

We know that you will support Parker and his family with the challenges they face. While we cannot take away the challenge of Parker's condition, we can take actions to assist with preventative measures.

TOILET BEHAVIOUR

EXPECTATIONS REGARDING BEHAVIOUR IN TOILETS

Toilet refurbishments have now been completed at school and we thought it was timely to remind students regarding the school's behaviour expectations when they are using the toilets. In the aim of enhancing student hygiene and safety, it would be appreciated if parents reinforce the following behaviours discussed at school with regard to the use of school toilets.

- Educating students about germs in toilets.
- Hygiene practices (washing hands, not taking food into toileting area etc.).
- Students should use the toilet responsibly (e.g. not waste time and keep noise to a minimum).
- Discourage play in toilets (e.g. should not be a location for tiggy or hiding games).
- Not a place for playing 'tricks' on others or contact with other people (minimal time in toilet).
- Strict rule one person in a cubicle at a time.
- When changing clothing for an activity, individual cubicles to be used with one person per cubicle.
- If individual showers or cubicles are not available, remember the public and private rule. Students must continue to wear clothing that would be acceptable for public places.
- Adults must not be in a one-on-one situation with students in toilets or changing areas.
- Adults are not permitted to use student toilets at St Patrick's. Adult toilets are provided in the administration block.
