This quote is a personal favourite, and I believe very true. This week we have started to see some fruits from a 'good start'. We have fewer Prep students struggling to separate from their parents of a morning (and vice versa) evidence that St. Patrick's is fast becoming a big part of their new normal. We know, even as adults, a new start takes a lot of courage (a Mercy Education value). It can be tempting to remain the same, in order to avoid discomfort, but essential if we want to grow and develop. A crab is a great example of how 'growing' can be uncomfortable. In order for growth to occur, a crab has to break out of its shell many times over. Initially each new shell is soft and gel like, making them vulnerable for a short time. Then, as if by magic, this new layer hardens in to a much larger, stronger shell which eventually becomes comfortable once more. This is what we witness in many of our students each year, when stretched safely but surely to build resilience, through new challenges, new learning, new friendships, new teachers and new experiences.

### **LENT 2025**



Wednesday of Week 6 (March 5) is Ash Wednesday, marking the start of the liturgical season of Lent. Lent is a time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. This means it is a time where we pray, act kindly towards other people, give up things we enjoy and give to others, as we prepare to celebrate the great feast of Easter. Our liturgy will be held in the Multi at 8.45am on March 5, led by Year 6S.

For forty days, we accompany Jesus on his passionate journey to Calvary and we see the courage he shows, despite his suffering. Like Jesus, we try to show kindness to others. Lent is a time of hope as we renew our relationship with God. During these forty days, it is an opportunity for us to take time to reflect on our lives, say sorry for any wrongdoing and focus on our relationship with God.

Every year during Lent we set the students challenges to help raise money for Project Compassion. Project Compassion is Caritas Australia's annual Lenten fundraising and awareness-raising appeal. # SPORTS NEWS

### BUNDABERG DISTRICT U12 SCHOOL SPORTS TRIALS-2025

Trial information will be advised in the school's newsletter each week detailing trial information for upcoming individual and team events.

Gaining selection in a Bundaberg District Team is the first step on the pathway to representing Wide Bay and Queensland. To represent Bundaberg District, students must be born 2013, 2014 & 2015 (only exceptional 10 year old students will be given permission to trial in team sports). The majority of team sport trials occur in February and March.

Please be aware of the following points:

- Team sports are selected in an U12 category and it is very unlikely that a 10 year old student would be selected, with the exception of Rugby League. Rugby League selects students in U10, U11 and U12 categories due to the contact nature of the sport.
- Bundaberg District trials are not 'have a go' trials. St Patrick's has a responsibility for sending students who we feel display high ability in the chosen sport and a high level of behaviour.
- Students wishing to trial must have a consent form issued by the school with authorisation from Mr Plumb, Ms Gollshewsky or Mr Egan. Students will not be able to participate in the trials without a *Bundaberg District Primary* Schools nomination form.
- · Cross Country and Athletics nominations will be made by the school after our school carnivals. Swimming & Aquathlon are the exceptions Wide Bay School Sport are responsible for the selection of these teams.

Is the next Minjee Lee or Cameron Smith out there??? Come along and try out!!!


