

PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

24 February 2023

This week started with a visit from magician, Mr. Fye. We invited many Kindergartens into our community to join us for this entertaining show. The same day, we welcomed a visit from Diocesan Child Safety and Mental Health advocates, to value-add to our commitment to making our Catholic schools safe and happy communities.

Mr. Fye's magic, however entertaining, was quite transparent through my adult lens. Conversely, in looking through a child's lens, students were mystified by the illusions created. Joy, innocence and excitement oozed from the faces of our young students and Mrs. Cook captured this beautifully through her photographer's lens. I enjoyed seeing our students so engaged in something that did not involve a screen.

These two experiences, morphed in to one by the end of my day. I reflected on how, the smoke and mirrors used to 'trick' one's perception, were blatantly obvious to me. Whereas, to the younger audience it was pure magic. It made me draw parallels between how vulnerable and easily impressed our young people can sometimes be. How easily 'tricked' young people can be in to feeling safe, when they may not be. Happily, our students were and are safe, due to the policies and procedures we thoroughly carry out. However, it reinforced for me, why we spend so many hours on Child Safety training at the beginning of each year and why Rockhampton Catholic Education is so invested in ensuring our schools are secure havens.

It is not only young children who can have their perceptions altered or blurred. In Genesis we read how Adam, our own paradigm, so easily surrendered to a temptation which was easy and self-fulfilling. Ultimately, this is a narrative which teaches us about human weakness and encourages us to have our eyes wide open, to those daily challenges that can stifle our growth and happiness. A challenge for all!

This week we received ashes to mark the beginning of Lent. This 40-day period echoes the time Jesus spent in the desert, giving up life's bare necessities and challenging his own self-control. Each Lenten season, I draw from the message that, even Jesus needed to take 'time out'. Time out, to escape the noise and clutter of a civilised world. It might be assumed that he did this to help him eradicate what might have been 'blurring' his thoughts and judgements, in order to carve out his next move, in realising his ultimate mission.

This week I read the following statement in Rockhampton Catholic Education's 'Well Being and Mental Health in the workplace' policy. 'In Australia, around 45% of people aged between 16 and 85 will experience a mental illness at some point in their life, while one in five Australian adults will experience a mental illness in any given year (ABS, 2007). Mental health problems are the third biggest health problem in Australia, after heart disease and cancer (Begg et al, 2007)'. In total mental illness is costing Australia about \$200-\$220 billion per year (Australian Gov, 2020).

In the modern world we live, it is even more challenging to find 'desert moments' to enable us to escape the noise and clutter, which can blur our perceptions and confuse our minds. Year 3B lead us in a beautiful song this week, challenging us to 'be God's grace', 'be God's mercy', 'be God's strength' for 'one person at a time'. Can I suggest we all start by making that 'one person' our own self, this Lenten season, to enable us the vision and strength necessary to 'be God's hands' for those most in need, as we prepare for Easter.


