"Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me". - Year 6: Non-perishable Christmas food and drinks


Starting from **Monday, November 10 until Friday 28 November**, donation baskets will be placed outside each year level for collection.






