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PRINCIPAL'S NEWS 9th November 2018

I loved Prep Orientation. Seventy-five new Preppies simply excited, optimistic and bursting with wonder and enthusiasm. I think they remind us well about how we all should live.

There's also been sadness this week. Most of you would know that Emerson Purkis, a student from Shalom, and her mother lost their lives through a car accident on Monday morning on their way to school and on Wednesday morning we prayed for Alan Chandry-Anil, a former student of our school.

Soon after we had prayed here at school, Alan had Communion with his family in Brisbane. His life support system was then removed, and Alan passed away surrounded with both family and love. He was just one of those beautiful, big-hearted kids who would always greet you with enthusiasm and a warm smile. He bravely fought for life, and words cannot communicate the sadness of his passing. I am only grateful he will live on in the memories of all those who knew and loved him. Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in peace. Amen.

These events are not a part of God's plan. The God who loves us, does not seek to see us hurt. The reality is that these events are a matter of chance and circumstance. The only thing predictable around such events is that they are completely random. They will devastate both the rich and the poor, the old and the young, and yes even the good and the bad. No matter how much we try to control every aspect of our lives, we are all absolutely vulnerable. Life is a very precious and fragile gift. It's fragility demands that we live fully and cherish the time we have with those we love. We will find God in our response – donating blood, supporting cancer research and loving more generously each day.

As the week ended, we prayerfully remembered the 100th anniversary of the Armistice which ended the First World War. I hope from time to time, you will take the opportunity to view the plaque we have placed near the Courtyard to mark the event. In the four years of World War 1, more than 300 000 Australians had served overseas, and over 60 000 of them had died. Surely the sense of devastation we have experienced this week serves to remind us of the sacrifice of all of these Australians and of their families. We want their lives, and the debt we owe, to be remembered. The words, 'Honour their Spirit' heads the plaque. It is a reminder of our gratitude and a call for us to live our lives in a way that is worthy of the sacrifices that
