**Dear Parents** 

I know this will surprise you, but my wife does not always display great enthusiasm when I arrive home – apparently I have never learned to pick up after myself, and I am not always as smart or funny as I like to think I am. I have learned over time however, that a thoughtful gesture every now and then is always appreciated.

With this in mind, I approached a Year One student recently with a business proposition. The cards are proudly personally handcrafted and they are amazing. The same thing. Their parents have offered support and advice, but the effort, ideas and how to manage the profits are all done by the girls.

I love that as these parents have taught a craft, they have also gently coached their children about work ethics, working effectively with others, and to value the things that they work hard and sacrifice for. Longer term they have planted the important idea of finding a way to be paid for doing something they love or are passionate about – particularly when that work brings happiness to so many others.

Every day I see many, many examples of parents nurturing and life-coaching their children, and so it is not surprising that we have so many amazing kids at our school. The investment of time and energy into your children is always rewarded in the long term and I love to see it in action every day.




#### PARENT TEACHER INTERVIEWS

Please note also that a second treatment should be applied 7-10 days after the initial treatment to kill the young lice that have hatched from the eggs remaining from the first treatment.

#### FINANCE NEWS

Fees have been issued and are due 28th August unless you have a payment plan in place in which case this merely serves as a statement of account. Upon receipt, please take time to review your invoice/statement and contact Finance Secretary Maria Davies if you have any queries or should you wish to setup a payment plan. Please check your junk box if you haven't received your statement.

In response to COVID-19 virus, Catholic Education Diocese of Rockhampton has extended the 100% discount on tuition fees for Concession Card holders in an effort to eliminate financial stress.

If you have been fortunate enough to have returned to work, please advise Finance Secretary that you no longer require this concession.

Your contribution through school fees is essential to the continued operation of your Catholic school however if you are having difficulty in paying school fees, please contact the finance secretary to discuss alternative arrangements.

#### **School Fee Payment Options**

Payments can be made at the school by cash, cheque, EFTPOS, Mastercard or Visa Card.

#### **Direct Deposit**

If you wish to pay by direct transfer from your bank account to ours, please ensure you use your parent code located at the top right corner of your statement as a reference. Our bank account details are noted at the bottom of your parent statement.

#### **Recurring Credit Card Billing**

If you wish to make regular recurring payments as you would normally from a bank account but prefer to use a Credit Card so as to gain advantages of frequent flyer points etc., it is as simple as completing a form. This form is available on the school website under Fees and Charges in the Menu tab, titled Direct Debit by Credit Card Form. Otherwise please contact St Patrick's School Finance Secretary Maria Davies at maria davies@rok.catholic.edu.au to have the form return e-mailed or call in to the office to have a printed copy provided.

#### **BPay**

BPay is the electronic bill payment service offered by Australia's leading banks and financial institutions providing a convenient, fast and easy way for debtors to pay their bills anytime/anywhere through the security of your telephone or internet banking. A BPay logo with the school's biller id and account reference is on your statement, if you choose to pay this way.

#### Parent Lounge

Simply login to the Parent Lounge Portal, select Make a Payment tab and follow the prompts to pay by credit card. An amount outstanding is automatically selected but you can amend this to pay a different amount.

#### Direct Debit

If you wish to set up direct debit from your account on a periodic basis, please do not hesitate to contact Maria Davies for assistance or simply download, complete and return the form titled Direct Debit by Bank Account Form available on the school website under Fees and Charges in the Menu tab.

#### Centrepay

Login to your Centrelink through the MyGov website to setup periodic payments.


