

#### PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

9th August 2024

This term we have certainly seen a rise in absenteeism directly linked to influenza. Queensland Chief Health Officer, Dr Catherine McDougall, has consequently reached out to schools to highlight concerns in relation to the number of cases that are emerging across the state and of concerns that only 13% of school aged children have been vaccinated against influenza this year. Last term, staff were offered free vaccinations which I hope has prevented some spread of the illness. COVID taught us that staying home can be a 'blessing' in disguise and a safe haven, even when affected by illness. This is suggested by the prayer below keeping those presently unwell in mind, but please note the importance of getting young people back in to the healthy routine of school life, once the haze of influenza lifts. I shared with staff recently, how our absentee rate is presently 89%. This is very close to the 90% expectation, and we are seeing slight growth each year. However, we think we can do better and are wanting to exceed this percentage by the end of the year. I have been reaching out and making contact with families who are well below this threshold and seek your assistance in ensuring your children are present to optimise learning outcomes.

We appreciate your on-going support and co-operation in keeping students well and connected, despite the challenges this winter has thrown many.

God bless those who suffer from the common cold.


#### FEAST DAY OF MARY MACKILLOP


