

PRINCIPAL'S NEWS 18 August 2023

This week we had Justin Coulson speak to our teachers about emotional intelligence and how crucial it is to the process of teaching young people in the modern world. I stayed on for the parent evening as well. It was wonderful to see so many of you there! Justin was very generous with his time and it was fabulous to hear some perspectives and ideas around the role of parenting, in such an open and honest way. We explored how the parenting 'goal posts' have continued to be shifted over time. The word 'parenting' wasn't even introduced to our vocabulary until 1958 and Dr. Coulson even refers to it as the 'impossible profession'. Impossible, but incredibly important! Three words Justin suggested, integral to the parenting cycle, were relationship, competence and autonomy. I found myself reflecting on this triangulation of words, the following evening, whilst watching the Matilda's take on the English Lionesses. It was an enormous achievement for our Australian female football team. The CEO of Football Australia is a relative of mine, but like so many, the code caught my attention for the first-time last week. This female team of champions definitely endeared themselves to a nation with their impressive display of resilience, rewarded with a win against France, as a result of penalty shootouts. We have long understood how it takes a village to raise a child and I began to ponder how integral the Matildas' relationships and connection would have been to prepare them for 'game night'. Similarly, Justin Coulson would say that children need strong connections to competent and caring adults and identifies relationships as the centrepiece to building resilience. He also suggests that competence-supportive environments are key. This is where parents (and educators) provide scaffolding and a sense of freedom and autonomy to allow their children the space to master their own ability to solve problems. In football terms, the Matilda's have clear boundaries. They know the rules, respect their referees, and stay within the clearly marked lines of play. However, the players are afforded a large amount of freedom and autonomy to creatively work to solve problems and ultimately score goals. In listening to Dr. Coulson this week and in watching him co-host hit TV program, Parental Guidance, I have learnt that it is a challenge to get this thing called 'parenting' 100% of the time. The same can be said for teaching. We are all human. We get tired. We work hard. We don't always get it right, but we all want the best for our children/students and to make the most out of these important professions. Dr. Blaine Fowers says it best when he suggests that the best way to be a good parent is to be a good person. This reminds me of the golden rule modelled to us through Jesus' life story and found in Matthew 7:12 "In everything, therefore, treat people the same way you want them to treat you'. Again, something we won't get right 100% of the time, but something we aspire to do and how lucky we are that we get to use this message in the lives of our young people.
