

PRINCIPAL'S NEWS 3 March 2023

Last week we launched the Lenten season, and my newsletter article delved into theology around the symbolic nature of this most significant event in the Christian calendar. We often use this time to try and animate more closely, Jesus, in our relationships and dealings with others. This week 3C carried this idea further, by introducing us to song 'Jesus Is Our Friend'. Lyrics such as 'Jesus is our friend...Jesus shows the way...to reach out in love in what we do and say...a heart of forgiveness when we lose our way' really helped to contextualise how to be better in the relational realm, as we prepare for Easter.

To flesh out these ideas further, I visited some very deep-thinking Preppies and sought their advice by asking the following questions;

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


