PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

1st March 2024

Schools are some days messy regardless of 'culture' but across the board this is what we all value and strive to achieve. Year 6's said it best in Courtyard Prayer this week, suggesting that in this community we aim to do what Jesus did, reminding us to use our energy in a good way not to waste it on negativity. This was a great message for their little Prep buddies to hear, who have been front and centre for them over recent weeks. Preppies have so much to learn in their first year of formal education and sometimes we forget some are only 4 years old. They are still so very young! Socialisation, routine and how to regulate their emotions are paramount and skills that take time, understanding and often a whole lot of patience. However, in turn, we have much to learn from the youngest ones as well. In watching our Prep students go about their business this week, I have learnt quite a lot from them and about them. Here are two examples of how they have added to our culture without even realising this week;

Life and Dignity of the Human Person and Solidarity

A group of young men were crouched down worried about their friend who had left his hat at home. They'd already checked in with class teacher, but the spare class hat had yet to be returned. Rather than go off and play without their little friend, they continued to problem solve. They felt empathy for their friend and wanted to see him happy. They put their heads together and decided I might be able to assist. I was able to find a tattered, badly fitting, yet well-received hat, which got this young man back on track with the support of his friends. I am sure he would not have forgotten his hat today but relationships were bolstered in this one simple incident.

Stewardship

Then a group of young ladies who stopped to admire the flowers growing from weeds, which in their eyes were a beautiful gift from God to be used to show appreciation and love of a teacher passing by.

These are very small acts of kindness, but this is where culture begins and it was lovely to witness in only their 6th week of learning. Young people don't always get it right, but then us adults often struggle too. Young people rely on us to forge the lens that they will see the world through. They are watching and listening to every word and hanging on our every action. However, they are often naturally more forgiving and resilient than our own adult selves. It is my guess that the parents of the children mentioned above are doing a fine job modelling and sharing positive, proactive solutions to problems.

Last year we heard from Justin Coulson (2018) and his message about how every human in a relationship will inevitably encounter conflict. He suggests this to be an important part of development, as conflict allows us to examine our behaviour and grow in empathy. The child psychologist explains how in creating an environment which allows students to see the impact they have on others, empathy is developed and can make longer last-ing changes in behaviour.

Year 6 in their Courtyard Prayer said 'Let's thank God for the beautiful people in our classes'. This sings so true. We have so many amazing students, but they are all learning and developing. Great humans are often a result of great parenting and a great education. It is important that we work together as a community to always use a positive lens when speaking and encouraging students to work through inevitable complications. This builds strong relationships and bolsters a sense of community which is so important to the 'culture' encouraged at St. Patrick's.

VACATION CARE OPENING SOON



St. Patrick's Catholic Primary School Bundaberg Outside School Hours Care (OSHC) is excited to announce the launch of our Vacation Care program in 2024 during the Easter School Holidays.

The program will be operational from 7:00 am to 6:00 pm and will cost \$59 per day.

The Vacation Care program will be published through Xplor Comms function in week 7 of each school term. Once released, families can commence booking through the Xplor Parents App. In week 8, the program opens to the wider school community and other schools.

Assistance is available through Centrelink to help you with the cost of childcare. To receive the subsidy*, you must care for a child 13 or younger who's not attending secondary school, unless an exemption applies. You must also use an approved childcare service, be responsible for paying the childcare fees, and meet residency and immunisation requirements.

*Childcare subsidy is calculated from the Vacation care daily fee \$59 - CCS% = Gap fee paid by parent







To get Childcare Subsidy (CCS), create a myGov account and link it to Centrelink. Here are the steps to create a myGov account:

- 1. Go to myGov and select Create account.
- 2. Select Continue with email.
- 3. Read the privacy notice and Terms of use.
 - If you understand and agree to the Terms of use, select Next.
- 1. Enter an Email address and select Next.
- 2. Enter the Code sent to your email, then select Next.
- 3. Enter your Mobile number (optional) and select Next.
- 4. Enter the Code sent to your mobile phone and select Next.
- 5. Enter a Password and then Re-enter password.









THIRD WEEK OF LENT—PROJECT COMPASSION REFLECTION

THIRD WEEK OF LENT

Exodus 20:1-17 | 1 Corinthians 1:22-25 | John 2:13-25

If the world is one great classroom, then God is a fantastic teacher. We have all had experience of this: the firm and gentle way that God opens our minds and helps us to understand.

Today's readings show three different ways that God tries to get through to us. In the first reading, God sets some clear expectations for behaviour. They are all based around respect, both for the teacher and for those with whom we share the class! At the same time, God reminds us 'I am the Lord your God who brought you out of the house of slavery.' In other words, these are not random rules. They are designed to protect our deepest freedom. Disregarding them sends us back into captivity.

In the Gospel, Jesus is annoyed by people who think they know everything but who have not properly understood the basic lesson about justice and reverence. 'Stop turning my father's house into a market.' Finally, St Paul speaks about wisdom. 'God's weakness is stronger than human strength.' This is another style again: inviting us into a mystery, almost using riddles to get us to think outside the box.

It is no surprise that the Catholic community has always valued education and done a great deal to make it accessible for people around the world. Just as God teaches us, so too do we try to share the wonderful gift of learning with others.

This week, Project Compassion brings us the story of Leaia, who lives in Samoa. With the support of Caritas Australia's local partner Caritas Samoa, a water tank was installed in Leaia's home to harvest rainwater. This means that her family can now have access to clean water to drink and bathe. The time that was previously spent walking to collect water in buckets from a neighbour down the street can now be used for other essential tasks and, most importantly, her children don't have to miss out on school. School is a doorway that opens onto a better world.

The Gospel today says that Jesus knew what a person had in them. We should try to be the same: to see the potential, not just the surface.

MUST run in footwear. The course will be clearly marked and supervised.

MUST bring their school hat and water bottle. Sunscreen will be provided by the school upon leaving the school grounds on the morning of the carnival.

Students placed first and second in A Division Born 2012, 2013 & 2014 will be considered for selection to compete at the Bundaberg District Cross Country trials to be held at Avoca State School on Friday 17th May. Qualifying times need to be met to participate in the District carnival.

'A' Division students are invited to attend a '<u>Walk the Course</u>' afternoon at Shalom on Wednesday, 24th April at 3:45 pm. This is a great opportunity for students to familiarise themselves with their respective events. There will be no changes to the 1km, 2km and 3km courses that were run in 2023.

All students finishing 1st-10th place and competing in A Division races will receive a ribbon for their place in the event. All other students will be advised of their final position in the race on the day. A warm invitation is open to all interested parents to support their child/children during this event. Approximate times have been outlined above, although please understand that there may be a need for flexibility with these times. Parking will only be made available in the Arts Precinct carpark (the first carpark to the left off Brother Hogan Drive). Please note the Staff toilets in the Shalom Sports Centre will be available to adults on the day. The toilet facilities in the 'Hangar' Sports Shed are for student use. Your cooperation with this is greatly appreciated.

Children will travel by bus to Shalom College with their class teacher who will supervise students in travel and throughout the carnival. Lunch and afternoon tea will be at normal times at school.

HOW TO NOMINATE YOUR CHILD

2015-2016 Born Competitors - Individual nominations are not required as all students in these age groups participate in a 1km event. Action Required - Login into <u>Parent Lounge</u> to approve their participation in the 1km event only.

2012, 2013 & 2014 Born Competitors – Nominations need to be made for students born in these age groups for either the competitive 3km/2km OR 1km Fun Run event. All students are expected to participate unless there is a health matter that may preclude their involvement in this carnival. Please discuss the course options with your child to ensure they are aware of their nominated event on carnival day. Action Required – Login to <u>Parent Lounge</u> to nominate your child in <u>either</u> the competitive (2km/3km) event or the Fun Run (1km) by Thursday 28th March.

SPORTS NEWS

BUNDABERG DISTRICT U12 SCHOOL SPORTS TRIALS-2024

Trial information will be advised in the school's newsletter each week detailing trial information for upcoming individual and team events. Gaining selection in a Bundaberg District Team is the first step on the pathway to representing Wide Bay and Queensland. To represent Bundaberg District, students must be born 2012, 2013 & 2014 (only exceptional 10 year old students will be given permission to trial in team sports). The majority of team sport trials occur in February and March. Please be aware of the following points:

- Team sports are selected in an U12 category and it is very unlikely that a 10 year old student would be selected, with the exception of Rugby League. Rugby League selects students in U10, U11 and U12 categories due to the contact nature of the sport.
- Bundaberg District trials are not 'have a go' trials. St Patrick's has a responsibility for sending students who we feel display high ability in the chosen sport and a high level of behaviour.
- Students wishing to trial must have a consent form issued by the school with authorisation from Mr Plumb, Ms Gollshewsky or Annette Hammermeister. Students will not be able to participate in the trials without a *Bundaberg District Primary Schools nomination form*.
- Cross Country and Athletics nominations will be made by the school after our school carnivals. Swimming & Aquath-Ion are the exceptions – Wide Bay School Sport are responsible for the selection of these teams.


