Gates Open—5:00pm Parents are welcome to bring a picnic dinner to enjoy with your family on the oval.



USEFUL SELF HELP RESOURCES FOR ANXIETY

Anxiety Canada provides parents with high quality self-help information and evidenced-based resources for anxiety and anxiety disorders in children. It includes information on many different anxiety-based difficulties and conditions including general anxiety, health anxiety, hording, obsessive compulsive disorder, panic disorder, body focused repetitive behaviours, post-traumatic stress, selective mutism, separation anxiety, social anxiety and phobias. Free BRAVE Online Program provides psychological therapy treatment for childhood and adolescent anxiety, and it was developed by the University of Queensland. It includes 10 sessions in which young people learn the skills to overcome fearful or worrying situations. There are separate sessions for children and for teenagers so that the examples and content are appropriate for these different age groups. BRAVE can be completed in your own home, at your own pace, and at a time that suits you. There is a component for children to complete and also one for parents so that you receive the knowledge and resources to best support your child. Home | BRAVE Self-Help Program (uq.edu.au)

Cool Kids Online Program was developed by the Macquarie University in 1993. The Cool Kids program is a structured, skills-based program that teaches children and their parents how to better manage anxiety. The Cool Kids Online program has 8 online lessons for parents and children to complete together over 10 weeks.


