

PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

Ist June 2018

It seems discussions regarding data are prolific at the moment, and so I wasn't surprised when an article from Dr Robert Drew was recently published in Education Review and shared at our Principals' Meeting. I'm sure the full article is easily found if you are interested. It began like this.

> Applying our background in customer experience and innovation, we turned our attention to the education sector in an effort to create schools that are truly remarkable, that families are drawn to enrol their children into, and that ensure students are ready for their future.

To create schools that are truly remarkable and engaging for our children, we need to understand what drives a family to send their child to a particular school. This research is part of a wider body of work helping schools to change. After interviewing and surveying over 400 families with primary and secondary school-aged children about their views on the schools their children attend, we published some of our findings.

Seventy-five per cent of the families were from fee-paying private schools across Australia, the remaining 25 per cent were from state public schools.

We asked respondents how likely they were to recommend their school to other families, and how they rated their school on 14 different dimensions.

The article is a short interesting read, and his findings were very clear. 'For families attending private school, by far the most important driver of their likelihood to recommend their school was how they perceived the care the school offered their children.'

I often ponder why it is that so many really good people choose our school, and I think this research offers a clear insight. It is about caring. I have been doing Prep 2019 enrolment interviews recently, and at every one of them I am clearly reminded of how deeply parents care for their children. I am also reminded of how much these parents hope and trust we will care for their children while they are in our school.

Staff here do care deeply. It is evident daily. The happiness I see from staff is usually generated by student success - progress in reading, a change in attitude, mastery of maths concepts, a great presentation and so on. Similarly when we have tears it will be about a student not giving their best efforts, or how a strategy to improve isn't working as well as was hoped, or maybe a teacher has learned of a tragedy at home.

Each day, I see the time and the emotional energy our staff invest in our students. Sometimes I fear they invest too much of themselves, and yet I also know that the care they show and the energy they invest is a reflection of who they are and what they stand for. Parenting and teaching are the same. They provide a purpose in life that inspires our best, even when things are tough. Thankfully being a community united by care, we are there to support each other.

Important Information:


- School photos purchased online DO NOT require envelopes returned to school*
