MEDICATION AT SCHOOL



If your child requires medication to be administered at school, please take note of our current school policy.

- For all medication it is essential parents complete a 'Request to Administer Medication Form' that is kept on file at the school office.
- Any medication provided must have a pharmacy label attached and should include the student's name, dosage and time/s to be taken.
- Office staff will administer the medication accordingly and liase with parent if necessary.
- No medication should be stored within student school bags and any requests for students to self-medicate (eg—asthma puffers) need to be approved by administration. This is to ensure the safety of all of our students on school grounds.

On Tuesday, March 17 we will be celebrating our Feast Day; St Patrick's Day. We will be holding a whole school Liturgy, led by Fr John, starting at 9am in the Multi.
