PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

26th August 2022

This week along with some other staff members, I was invited to a Year 6 class for a 'Faith Interview'. I must admit I was thinking this would be a very simple twenty minutes of easy yes/no questions. In fact the questions were insightful and probing and within minutes I found myself answering deeply personal questions about how I live, what I believe and why. I don't have such deep conversations often, and certainly not with 11-year-olds.

The other part I realized very early in, was that these kids know me. They've talked with me, they've interacted with me personally and more importantly they've observed how I deal with others – adults and children alike, on a daily basis for nearly seven years. Eleven-year-olds have a very highly tuned and focused 'bull....' monitor. They know whether or not you're being honest with them.

It's important then, that we are always authentic. When we deal with issues, we try and deal with them in a way that reflects Catholic Social Teaching. Put simply - See, Judge and Act.

See. When we are made aware of an issue, we try to get a picture of what's going on. We need to know exactly what is happening and why it is happening and who are the people involved. We interview students to make sure we have a clear understanding of the issue.

Judge. We look at how we feel about the issue. We look at what is happening and compare it to what should be happening. In a Catholic School what should be happening is informed by Gospel values like concern for others and respectful relationships.

Act. What can we do to bridge the gap between what is happening and what should be happening. This informs how we move forward to address the issue.

If you watch closely when staff, Leadership Team members and particularly Mrs H deal with issues, you'll see these steps. It is extremely difficult to do well, but then not many really important things are easy. I hope in your families and your workplaces, you do something similar. Learning to do what is right and to get along really provide a foundation for good culture.


TUCKSHOP CLOSED WEEK 8

PARENT SURVEY ON STUDENT WELLBEING AND LEARNING



The Australian government has asked Catholic School Parents Australia to enter into an agreement to inform them of existing and emerging issues that are of concern to Catholic school families, especially those issues that impact their children's health, wellbeing and/or learning.

In particular, they are keen to hear the perspectives of parents and carers from families of children with challenges around learning, and from families with children in remote school settings. As a result, CSPA, in partnership with the Australian Research Alliance for Children and Youth (ARACY), have developed a parent survey which will be the key instrument for evidence gathering.

The CSPA 2022 Parent Survey on Student Wellbeing and Learning is now live through until Wednesday 31 August 2022.

COVID-19 UPDATE

St Patrick's Catholic Primary School wishes to advise you that, during the past week, we have been notified of positive cases of COVID-19 in our school community.

St Patrick's Catholic Primary School regularly consults with the Catholic Education Office and relevant authorities and continues to follow the advice of Queensland Health regarding cleaning requirements.

Queensland Health has advised that no quarantine of students or staff is required as a result of school based contact.

As COVID-19 remains active in our community we ask you to continue to monitor your child's/children's health and if they develop any flu-like symptoms:

- Keep your child/children at home
- Seek a PCR or Rapid Antigen test where it is recommended and notify the school of positive results.
- Follow the advice of Queensland Health

As we continue to navigate the pandemic, please remind your child/ren to:

- maintain good hand hygiene at all times
- cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue or the inside of their elbow and dispose of tissues in the bin immediately.
- practice social distancing from others where possible
- wear masks when required

We will continue to work closely with health authorities to keep our school community informed of any developments and advice. Thank you once again for your ongoing support.

FLU AND INFLUENZA ADVICE

As you are aware every year Queensland experiences an influenza or flu season. Qld Health has advised that it has recorded an increase in the number of influenza notifications. Therefore, is timely to remind parents and care-givers not to be complacent about the flu.


Flu is a virus more serious than the common cold and can be spread through talking, coughing and sneezing. Symptoms include sudden fever, dry cough, muscle aches and pains, fatigue, headache, sore throat and a stuffy or runny nose.

If your child has flu-like symptoms, the following is advised:

- Keep your child home from school
- Ensure your child washes their hands regularly with soap and water or sanitiser gel
- Encourage your children when coughing or sneezing, to cover their mouth and nose with disposable tissues which should be disposed of immediately
- Ensure they drink plenty of fluids and get lots of rest
- Consult your doctor if you are concerned about their symptoms.



The school requests that anyone displaying flu-like symptoms stay at home until such symptoms have passed. Families should also reinforce the recommended protective actions listed above. Increased awareness and ongoing attention to prevention and control measures, such as vaccination and good hygiene, are steps that we can all promote to reduce the impact of influenza.
