This week, Year 2N shared a reading from Luke **'give and you will receive many gifts'**. This message was timely, considering we are into our second week of Lent. This weekend we will celebrate the 20<sup>th</sup> Bundaberg Catholic Education Race Day. 21 Years ago, I remember venturing to Rockhampton via bus, to attend the St. Patrick's Catholic Education Race Day in Rockhampton. I accompanied other parents and educators from our local Bundaberg Catholic schools. It was an excellent day and happily Mr. Rob Alexander (then St. Patrick's Parent and Shalom Leadership Team member) formed a committee and Bundaberg's own Catholic Schools Race Day was realised. Twenty Years on and this event continues to strengthen partnerships and raise funds for our schools and the Bundaberg community thanks to the leadership of Mr. Peter O'Beirne (former St. Mary's/Shalom Parent and Business Owner) and other interested parties.



## SCHOOL STUDENT BROADBAND INITIATIVE (SSBI)

To provide education opportunities for families that have limited internet access at home, the Australian Government is providing free National Broadband Network (NBN) services for eligible families. This is called the [School Student Broadband Initiative](#) (SSBI).

Families can self-nominate until the end of April 2025 to receive a free service, and they will receive this free service until **30 June 2028**. This is a wonderful opportunity for families that may have limited capacity to have home internet.

There are eligibility criteria for the initiative. To be eligible, a family must:

- Have a child living at home that is enrolled in an Australian school.
- Have no active broadband service over the NBN, and not had an active service in the past 14 days.
- Live in a premise that can access a standard NBN service.

Anglicare Victoria operate the National Referral Centre on behalf of the initiative, and families can check their eligibility by contacting the centre. If eligible, families will be provided further information and a voucher which can be used with participating Internet Service Providers (ISP) who will then arrange the NBN connection:

## Big Water Walk

This term during Lent, we have been learning about those less fortunate than ourselves through the stories of Project Compassion. As in previous years we will hold our annual Mini Fair as the major school fundraiser for Project Compassion.

In addition to our Mini Fair, our Mini Vinnies Team are busy organising a relevant and relatable fundraiser for our school. Because water quality and access are a focus of Project Compassion this year, we will be asking students to participate in our Big Water Walk.

Today students will receive their small Project Compassion donation boxes for each child to take home. We will ask that on **Friday, March 28** students bring back those donation boxes with a few coins in it and participate in our Big Water Walk. More details will follow on actual logistics, but the Mini Vinnies team are envisioning a walk around the school 'carting' water from one location to the next to highlight the lengths some children have to go to access clean water.

## St Patrick's Day

Don't forget that on Monday, March 17 we will have our St Patrick's Day celebrations. This will include a Liturgy at 9.30am in the Multi, announcement of our Student Leadership Teams (Mini Vinnies, Reef Guardians and House Captains) and a scavenger hunt for the students. Parents are most welcome to attend. Please also remember that students are encouraged to bring along ONE green accessory to wear on Monday to celebrate St Patrick's Day.

## Second Week of Lent (*week beginning Monday 17 March*)

**Toefuata'iga** - (*Toy-foo-ah-tah-ing-ah*) is a 13-year-old primary school student from Samoa. Samoa may be a country surrounded by water, but access to clean drinking water is scarce in some areas, with many families facing extreme hardship as a result.

Toefuata'iga's school community struggled without reliable access to clean water, which impacted students' education and hygiene. Teachers often had to leave the school to fetch water from nearby homes, disrupting lessons and adding strain to the community. When the water ran out at the school, students were sent home which meant they missed out on valuable learning time.

Thanks to the support of Caritas Australia in partnership with Caritas Samoa, Toefuata'iga's school now has a 10,000 L water tank through a Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) program. Teachers and students are now able to focus on education and improved hygiene.

*"Now that we have the water tank, things are so much better, we can stay at school all day, and I get to spend more time learning and playing with my friends. I'm happy that we don't have to go home early anymore."* – said Toefuata'iga.

This transformative story is just one example of how Caritas Australia's Project Compassion creates waves of change around the world.

### THE IMPORTANCE OF ATTENDANCE AT SCHOOL FOR YOUR CHILD'S DEVELOPMENT CANNOT BE UNDERSTATED.

At St. Patrick's we encourage families to send their children to school **every day**. We understand children get sick and issues occur which can affect school attendance.

If your child is unable to attend school, the Diocese requests families notify the school. No notification means school resources are often spent contacting families seeking explanation for absence.

We appreciate your support by continuing to inform the school about your child's absence via **spb\_absentees@rok.catholic.edu.au** or the **Orbit app**.

If there is an absence of which you are aware that is for 10 days or more, families can complete the Diocese "Request for Extended Leave" form. These can be accessed at the school front office.

Please note, family holidays would not be granted an exemption.

### Notice: Tummy Bug Alert

We have recently noticed an increase in children being sent home with a tummy bug, which may indicate a potential outbreak. To help prevent the spread, please be reminded that, as per the *Public Health Regulation 2018*, children experiencing diarrhoea and/or vomiting must be excluded from school for at least **24 hours after their last episode** of vomiting or loose bowel movement.

# SPORTS NEWS

## BUNDABERG DISTRICT U12 SCHOOL SPORTS TRIALS—2025

Trial information will be advised in the school’s newsletter each week detailing trial information for upcoming individual and team events.

Gaining selection in a Bundaberg District Team is the first step on the pathway to representing Wide Bay and Queensland. To represent Bundaberg District, students must be born **2013, 2014 & 2015** (only exceptional 10 year old students will be given permission to trial in team sports). The majority of team sport trials occur in February and March.

Please be aware of the following points:

- Team sports are selected in an U12 category and it is very unlikely that a 10 year old student would be selected, with the exception of Rugby League. Rugby League selects students in U10, U11 and U12 categories due to the contact nature of the sport.
- Bundaberg District trials are not ‘have a go’ trials. St Patrick’s has a responsibility for sending students who we feel display high ability in the chosen sport and a high level of behaviour.
- Students wishing to trial must have a consent form issued by the school with authorisation from Mr Plumb, Ms Gollshewsky or Mr Egan. Students will not be able to participate in the trials without a ***Bundaberg District Primary Schools nomination form***.
- Cross Country and Athletics nominations will be made by the school after our school carnivals. Swimming & Aquathlon are the exceptions – Wide Bay School Sport are responsible for the selection of these teams.
