The Box

The story goes that some time ago, a man punished his 4 year old daughter for wasting a roll of gold wrapping paper. Money was tight and he became frustrated when the child tried to decorate a box for Father's Day. Nevertheless, the little girl brought the gift to her father the next morning and said, "This is for you, Daddy." He was embarrassed by his earlier over reaction, but his anger flared again when he found the box was empty. He yelled, "Don't you know that when you give someone a present, there's supposed to be something inside it?'

The little girl looked up at him with tears in her eyes and said, "Oh, Daddy, it is not empty. I blew kisses into the box. All for you Daddy." The father was crushed. He put his arms around his little girl, and he begged for her forgiveness. It is told that the man kept that gold box by his bed for years and whenever he was discouraged, he would take out an imaginary kiss and remember the love of the child who put it there. In a very real sense, each of us as humans have been given a gold container filled with unconditional love and kisses from our children, friends, and family. There is no more precious possession anyone could hold.

This week we celebrated the father figures in our lives at a beautiful Father's Day Liturgy led by Year Three. After reading Luke 2: 41-51 and how Joseph went back looking for his Son Jesus, concerned for his safety, I reflected on how a father's love is like an anchor. We float somewhat on our own, but when our safety is compromised, they spring into action to keep us safely anchored. I then described our heavenly Father as the light house. There to guide our fathers and their grown children, once strong and wise enough to navigate life on their own. I had a hard-working father that wasn't overly hands-on during my younger years, but later learned of the three jobs he held so that we could have a better future. I believe it is important to have a father figure in our lives for as long as we are blessed, but also recognise how the tides of life change. Eventually we find we are an anchor for our fathers and mothers, like they once were for us. Life has a wonderful way of evolving full circle. It was heart-warming to see many heart-felt, hand-made gifts make their way out of the St. Patrick's gates this afternoon. Like the gold box, at first glance they are not always the most impressive, however, Father's Day gifts have come a long way since my children were little. My husband and I are preparing to down-size and these priceless gifts are what we are struggling to let go. Why? Just like the gold box, they remind us of the unconditional love which was and is given so freely to us from our children. However, you spend Father's Day, enjoy every moment of knowing you are loved, appreciated and cherished! Life can be imperfect and even messy, but if you scratch the surface this is 99% always true if you've been blessed enough to take on the role of father figure in a young person's life. Savour the journey...always!
