I attend weekend Mass at Bargara each week - something I quite enjoy. Last week however was a little different in that I was asked to fill in as a Reader at the liturgy. Sounds silly I know, but I really don't love speaking in public.

Giving myself the same advice I'd give our students, when the time came to read, I had a quick chat to myself about stepping up, took a deep breath, and launched into the reading.

According to my wife, Mason from Prep who was seated near us, got quite the surprise when he heard Mr Fox's voice across the PA at church when we were so far from school. He quickly pointed out his principal to his mum and listened to the reading.

I returned to my seat, glad the ordeal was over. I had just found my seat, when Mason turned towards me, looked me in the eye, and said, "Well done Mr Fox!"

It was pretty special for a number of reasons, but what really impressed me was that at five years of age, Mason had already learned to positively affirm people when the opportunity presents. It is an amazing skill.

You see, conversations form culture. From your own experiences, you know that in families where there are constant 'put downs' and blame, the family culture quickly becomes toxic. It is equally as evident in schools or in any workplace.

I love experiences like school camps, where students face challenges and do numerous team building experiences. Students learn very quickly the power of affirmation and being supportive in order to achieve any form of success, and they get opportunities to practice this skill.

If you wish to improve the culture and performance of any group be it family, sporting team, school or workplace, start with conversations. Affirm publicly at every opportunity. Correct privately and sensitively. Refuse to join in conversations where persons who are not present, are put down or gossiped about. Call out poor behaviour when you see it - don't walk past. It's not easy, yet I have seen a five year old who is well on the way. It is a responsibility we all share if we want to enjoy the benefits.

8+ years old are able to prepare for the sacraments of Reconciliation, Confirmation and Eucharist (First Communion).






