

PRINCIPAL'S NEWS 16 June 2023

'The Moso Bamboo plant grows in China and far east. After a Moso is planted, no visible growth occurs for up to five years-even under ideal conditions! Then, as if by magic, it suddenly begins growing at the height of nearly two- and one-half feet per day, reaching full height of ninety feet within six weeks. But it's not magic. The Moso's rapid growth is due to the miles of roots it develops during those first five years, five years of getting ready.'

When I was a young teacher, I came across this reflection written by Joel Weldon. I used it at many Parent/ Teacher nights, early in my career and again when navigating my way through parenthood. It strongly parallels the teaching and learning process for many. This lesson from nature, reminds us that sometimes growth and development are difficult to measure.

The Moso reminds me especially of one young man's journey through the education process. I taught this delightful human in his 3rd and 4th year of schooling. When I first assessed this student in his formative years, he had very little alphabet and next to no phonological awareness. This made the reading process seem impossible for him to grasp. Despite his challenges, he hung on every word and never lost his enthusiasm for learning. He was a pleasure to teach. However, I was often frustrated that despite the intervention poured into this child from home and school, the progress could not be measured and seemed slight. Years later, I noticed his name appearing alongside 'English' on the Shalom Awards list. This really caught my attention and made me immensely proud, but also curious. Years later we caught up. He had recently graduated from university as an engineer, so I acknowledged how he must have experienced great success by the end of his school years. His response, 'I could have done better Miss'. Looking perplexed he smiled and in jest said 'I only got an OP 2—should have got an OP 1'. You see it was his work ethic that had developed at a faster rate than his initial success, which proved his biggest asset once all the growth began to occur.

Report cards will be released next week, so I thought the Moso Bamboo tree and this young man's story, timely. Report cards are wonderful pieces of information to be shared between Teacher and Parent, but don't always indicate the growth occurring below the surface. For some the progress will be substantial, but for others, the growth is yet to come.

Today, I had the privilege to go for a quick visit to many diverse countries of interest, thanks to the Year 6 co-hort. This was the culmination of their Project Based Learning. It was an educational experience, not only for the students sharing their newfound knowledge, but for me as a visitor. It was a great example of learning in a productive and interesting way. I asked some students what they enjoyed about this term's project. They brought my attention to the skills that were necessary to learn, before encountering the creative and productive part of the task. The skills they listed were research, mapping, communication, geography, culture, editing, spelling, pamphlet writing and formation, generic structure, math, group work, arts, crafts, physical education, marketing and so much more.



STEP 2

Enter your school code:

K5C 1GB PD7

in the 'order and download' box. This will take you to your school's secure online ordering site.



STEP 3

Click on 'Order Photos' and complete your details and procedures. During this process you can place orders for additional children at your school and sibling photos, if available.





cash/envelope ordering

Your school prefers orders to be placed online. However, if you are unable to order online, please complete your order using the order envelope provided.

STEP 1

Complete a separate order envelope for each individual child's package/s ordered. If ordering for more than one child, payment should be enclosed in the envelope of the eldest child and this should be indicated on the envelope of the other child/children (the envelope that does not have cash enclosed).

STEP 2

Enclose exact cash payment in one envelope for the package/s you are ordering. Payment for more than one child should be in the eldest child's envelope and marked at the bottom of the envelope in the space provided.

STEP 3

Return your completed envelope/s, with correct cash payment, to our photographers on the day.

Please note: You must enclose exact correct payment, as change is not available. Credit card payments can only be made online and we no longer accept cheques. There is a separate envelope for sibling photo orders, should your school choose to offer sibling photos.

School photographs will be returned approximately 6 weeks after the day of photography. Please note this delivery timeframe is dependant on proofing and additional photography days at your school.

IMPORTANT - "not for publication" students

If you have instructed your school that your child's image is "not for publication" (sometimes called "do not publish" or "not for media release" instructions), the school will ensure that your child is not presented to our photographers on photo day and school photographs will not be available for purchase. If you wish to change your instruction, then you must notify your school, so they change their records and identify your child as able to be photographed for school photography purposes. All students presented to our photographers by your school on photo day will be photographed, their images will appear in school photography packages with their fellow students and these packages will be available to purchase by all families.




