This week is National Child Protection Week and this year's message is that 'Every child in every community needs a fair go', complemented with the theme 'Every conversation matters'. We have layers of protection for the young people in our community and opportunities are offered to give students a 'fair go'. Teachers receive ongoing training in this area and develop strong, professional and supportive relationships which aim to ensure a safe community for our young people to thrive. This week we held a special Morning Tea to celebrate 'Teacher Assistant Appreciation Week' and each one received a symbolic Angel. Teacher Assistants have an important role to play and are the 'ANGELS' that are often in the right place at the right time to add another safety net for those in our care. St. Patrick's is blessed to have its own Counsellor, Mrs. Anita Katajamaki, who is presently at a Child Protection conference receiving up to date information and training to serve our young people well. She is a listening ear and provides some great advice to parents with some helpful links provided below for your perusal. 
