Easter—What's the fuss about?

Easter, it is just another commercialised chance for large corporations to make money from? A time for people to eat in excess and give treats to one another? An excuse for a long weekend? Some sceptics would say yes to each of these points. I would argue strongly against that way of thinking. While navigating the maze of commercialisation, we can and should find the elements of our Faith woven within and bring those to the forefront of our personal reflections and celebrations.



For myself, as a member of the Catholic faith, Lent, the lead up to Easter, is liturgically a time of preparation and thought. A time for reflection, a time to give and a time to be thankful. A time of sadness, culminating with Good Friday which then leads to ultimate celebration and a time of rejoicing during the season of Easter.

As a member of a thriving Catholic Primary School, Lent encompasses praying, fasting and alms giving. I love that over the years the focus within our school includes 'giving up' something for Lent but can also transform into 'giving to' others in our community and beyond. Easter is a time of great joy for young children, the excitement of eggs, hunts and family time can easily be combined with the elements of faith — we just need to make it happen. I absolutely love a homily I heard Fr Andrew Hogan give when he was in Bundaberg a few years ago. At one of our Easter Liturgies, he produced a whopping great chocolate Easter egg in the middle of the liturgy. The delighted and awe filled sounds of our students made some of our staff begin to wonder if they needed to intervene and keep the students contained. But no, Fr Andrew went on to talk about the meaning behind the hollow chocolate Easter eggs (a representation of the empty, sealed tomb of Jesus) we receive at Easter. A talking point that I still use when speaking with our students around Easter time.

As a mother, wife, daughter and sister, from my point of view Easter is one of two extremely special times during the year to express my faith, show those I hold most precious in my heart how much I love them and a wonderful opportunity to gather with family and friends to celebrate. I embrace the eggs (tomb), bunnies (new life) and opportunity to have family time. I also ensure my family knows why we are privileged enough to have this time together, the 'reason for the season' if you will. We celebrate not only with family, friends and good food, but we also nourish our souls by attending Mass, discussing Holy Week and Easter and reflect on the amazing commitment of Jesus to live out his mission.



So, what is all the fuss? Is it wrong to want to decorate your table with beautiful bunnies, eggs and foliage? No, embrace it. Talk about it. Own it as a wonderful reflection of faith and enjoy, maintain and even create some new individual family traditions. Jesus died for us, that is why we can be thankful and celebrate – it is worth the fuss.

Fourth Week of Lent (Week beginning Monday 31 March)

Irene lives in a remote village in the Kongolo Region in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC). Life hasn't been easy for Irene. After losing her father in a war, Irene and her family were forced to flee their home. Life became even more challenging when her husband left, leaving Irene to raise her 2 children alone. Without finishing her education and with few job opportunities in her village, she struggled to provide even the basics for her family.

Things began to change when Irene joined the Youth Capacity Strengthening Program (YCSP), run by Caritas Kongolo with the support of Caritas Australia. Through the program, Irene learned sewing skills and was provided with a sewing machine and fabric. Irene also gained farming skills. Now, she grows enough food to feed her family and even shares her sewing knowledge by mentoring other women in her community.



"Before, women depended on men's income, but now, with our sewing skills, we can take care of ourselves," Irene said.

BUNDABERG DISTRICT U12 SCHOOL SPORTS TRIALS—2025

Trial information will be advised in the school's newsletter each week detailing trial information for upcoming individual and team events.

Gaining selection in a Bundaberg District Team is the first step on the pathway to representing Wide Bay and Queensland. To represent Bundaberg District, students must be born **2013**, **2014 & 2015** (only exceptional 10 year old students will be given permission to trial in team sports). The majority of team sport trials occur in February and March.

Please be aware of the following points:

- · Team sports are selected in an U12 category and it is very unlikely that a 10 year old student would be selected, with the exception of Rugby League. Rugby League selects students in U10, U11 and U12 categories due to the contact nature of the sport.
- Bundaberg District trials are not 'have a go' trials. St Patrick's has a responsibility for sending students who we feel display high ability in the chosen sport and a high level of behaviour.
- Students wishing to trial must have a consent form issued by the school with authorisation from Mr Plumb, Ms Gollshewsky or Mr Egan. Students will not be able to participate in the trials without a *Bundaberg District Primary Schools nomination form*.
- · Cross Country and Athletics nominations will be made by the school after our school carnivals. Swimming & Aquathlon are the exceptions Wide Bay School Sport are responsible for the selection of these teams.



Does your 8-14 year old child struggle with reading?



GRIFF LINC READING RESEARCH



FREE ONLINE TUTORING FOR 6 MONTHS

Students must be available 2 -3 times per week for 30 mins

The Griff Linc Reading Research team has developed a new tutoring method for middle years students struggling with reading. The tutors use artificial intelligence to write short texts specific to your child's interests and reading level, and use a six-step teaching method during each tutoring session. The researchers collect data on your child's reading assessments at the beginning and end of the project, as well as video recordings of the tutoring sessions. This data will be used to evaluate the impact of the project on middle years students struggling with reading.


