## PERSONALISED LEARNING

The Year 5 Teachers meet on a regular basis to plan collaboratively using the Australian Curriculum. During our Maths and English blocks, we use learning intentions (what we are learning) and success criteria (how we will know if our learning has been successful) to ensure that all classes are exposed to the same content at the same time.

Lessons and learning will be differentiated to suit your child's needs.

## **IPADS**

We will prepare students by exposing them to the types of questions they will encounter, developing our typing skills and exploring the different writing styles they may be asked to demonstrate.
